Lady Dogs Claim First,


Boys Take Second in Cross Country Showdown

The Hooker Dogs and Lady Dogs cross-country teams traveled to Edmond, Oklahoma, this past weekend for the state championship meet. They have been working hard all season with hopes of bringing home the gold. After an eventful afternoon, both teams were able to finish their races without any rain or lightning delays.

The girls' race was very close between Hooker and Regent Prep. After the race, no one knew the outcome, but it was clear that it had been tight. Senior Analisee Gonzalez scored the final point by holding off a Regent Prep runner down the final stretch, beating her by thirty-two hundredths of a second. This secured the win for the Hooker Lady Dogs by just one point, resulting in an undefeated season. The girls returned home with their fourth consecutive state title, having not lost the crown since first winning in 2021. All seven runners finished in the top 25: Izabella Neville, 3rd place, with a time of 12:11; Ember Stevens, 6th, with a time of 12:21; Yarel Mesta, 10th, with a time of 12:36; Jenna Carter, 17th, with a time of 12:58; Analisee Gonzalez, 20th, with a time of 13:16; Ana Deherrera, 23rd, with a time of 13:20; and Finley Duncan, 25th, with a time of 13:25.

The boys' race was also expected to be tight between Hooker and Regent











Prep. They battled hard throughout the race, but Regent Prep ultimately came out on top. The boys finished as state runners-up, bringing home silver. Although it was not the result they wanted, they had a very successful season and will walk away as one of the fastest boys teams to ever compete at Hooker.

Hooker Shuts Out Crescent

On a rainy and muddy
Friday night, the Hooker
Bulldogs delivered a dominant
performance against the
Crescent Tigers, securing a
decisive 40-0 victory in their
senior night matchup. The
relentless downpour
transformed the field into a slick,
slippery battleground, making
every play a challenge. Despite
the less-than-ideal conditions,
Hooker's power running game
and aggressive defense proved
unstoppable.

From the opening whistle, the Bulldogs showcased their strength. Quarterback Kleat Martens(Sr.) and running backs Peyton Parker (Sr.), Landen Lee(Sr.), Ayden Woolridge(Jr.), Justin Palacios(So), navigated the wet field with surprising agility. The Bulldogs' offensive line,

showing grit and determination, pushed the Tigers back on nearly every play, opening up huge running lanes. Hooker's ball carriers seemed relaxed in the conditions, powering through the slippery field and picking up big chunks of yardage.

On the defensive side of the ball, the Bulldogs were equally dominant. The Bulldogs held the Tigers to negative yards the entire night. Crescent's offense was unable to gain any momentum, as Hooker's defensive line and linebackers consistently disrupted plays, forcing turnovers and forcing the Tigers to punt.

Hooker won 40-0. While the seniors made sure to win for their last home non playoff game. Senior Kleat Martens had 258 passing yards for 2 touchdowns and 70 rushing



yards for 1 touchdown. Landen
Lee (Sr.) had 21 rushing yards.
Peyton Parker (Sr.) had 1
touchdown with 4 Tackles.
Senior Tatum Trimble had 52
receiving yards for 1 touchdown.
Nate Hidalgo (Sr.) had 2 sacks for a loss of 26 yards. While seniors
Daniel Quezada, Trace Duncan,
Rhett Nunley, Jonathan Cano,
Cale Metcalf, Raul Garcia,
Alfonso Ortiz, Tryston Hidalgo,
and Luis Barraza also had a

2024 Elections

2024 brought one of the most fiercely contested Presidential elections in modern history. Former President Donald Trump, the Republican nominee, faced off against Vice President Kamala Harris, the Democratic nominee. Between the two main candidates and those in the Independent, Libertarian, and Green parties over 147 million votes were cast in this year's presidential election. In the hours and days that followed the closing of the polls, Donald Trump was declared the winner of the 2024 Presidential election. Trump secured a total of 312 electoral votes with Harris

receiving 226. Donald Trump will officially take office on Inauguration Day, which is scheduled for January 20, 2025. The United States Senate and House also held elections earlier this month. The US Senate now consists of 53 Republican seats and 47 Democratic seats. The House of Representatives is still awaiting results from a few states, but presently sits at 214 Republican seats and 205 Democratic seats. The party to reach 218 will hold the majority.




Dog Chow


Polls Tell of HS Students' Thanksgiving Favorites


Yadira's Recommendation A Child Called "It" By Dave Pelzer


