Time for a Change



Stretching for the goal against his opponents, senior George Potter says, "It ain't no thang like a Chicken Wang to beat Hixson!"




English was not the only language class for college bound students.


Student council members had many responsibilities. They put all the activities together and helped with pep rallies. They organized intramurals, homecomings, food drives, club meetings, and elemen-







Incredible Times






Boys' Tennis


The Toughest Six Minutes in Sports
