Dear Parishioners,

This week, we have a Holy Day of Obligation on Wednesday as we celebrate All Saints Day. It is a day the church offers as we honor the holy men and women, many unknown, who loved the Lord and reside with Him in eternity. Often, with our focus on canonized saints, we forget that that is only a small fraction (at least, I hope it is) of those who have been granted eternity with the Lord. The feast also reminds us that we, too, are called to be saints – the Lord makes it possible, but the response is ours.

Thursday is All Souls Day. This day is given as a reminder of our duty to pray for the souls who are still awaiting full perfection before they are given eternity. They may have reparations yet to do – while forgiven for the sin, they still need to work at repairing the damage done often through repairing the relationship. But also, some souls are in purgatory because of a disordered attachment to sin – not serious enough to cast them into Hell, but the attachment prevents them from the full love of God. Our loving prayers assist them, so it is good and holy to pray for the departed souls.

One such means is through Mass Intentions. Every Mass holds unlimited grace, and even as a layperson, you may specify a specific intention for a departed soul, a living individual or family, or another appropriate cause (such as pro-life or for peace, etc.). But you can also ask a priest to offer the Mass for a specific intention and you can offer a stipend for that intention.

There are few intentions that would not be acceptable – those that are against the faith, being one of the few categories. For those that might be a little more sensitive, like the conversion of a particular person, it might be best announced as "A Special Intention." We announce the intentions in the bulletin – which is more than sufficient. There is no requirement that the priest makes that intention known or announce it.

In our diocese, the typical Mass stipend is \$10, and goes to the priest who offers that intention only after the Mass has been offered. In our parishes, these stipends are given to the parish (Either St. Edward or to St. Eloi for the St. Eloi parish Masses or masses to be offered at the convent). Do not make any check out to me or to the Sisters. The check or cash can be mailed, dropped in the collection basket specifically marked for Mass Stipends, or dropped off at the parish office. Please do not use your parish envelopes for this purpose as the envelopes are contributions to the parish, but Mass Stipends are not – there is no tax benefit for stipends as there is an expectation for a service (Mass to be offered for that intention) attached to the offering, and that offering eventually goes to the priest, not the parish (and I as a priest pay taxes on that stipend).

This might be a little confusing as the stipend is not required, but if offered, it is for a service versus a straight donation in the collection where there is no directly expected service. The Intention is not buying the Mass or buying grace, but is a way of supporting the priest who prays that intention at Mass.

For those curious, the stipend developed as a means of 'paying' the priest for our most important work, but sadly has been used at times to incentivize priests to offer Mass once a day. Days when there are more than one Mass, only one stipend is kept – the other(s) are forwarded to the Diocese.
