SPORTS ACTION

The Girls Track and Field Team performed well Friday at the Davison meet and placed third in the large school division. The Chemics had a strong showing in the field events with Emma McLaughlin winning the long jump, Abigail Shealy taking second in both the shot and discus and Abby Kendall placing second in the high jump. Cam Mackezyk placed first in the 200m and anchored the second place 4 x 400 relay team. The 4 x 200 relay members Anna Merges, Braxtin Smith, Mollie Russell and Aubrey Jarosiewicz performed well also.

Softball: Linden scored five runs in the fourth inning, which helped them defeat the Chemics 8-0 on Saturday. Linden got on the board in the top of the fourth inning after Ella Kenyon doubled, scoring one run, Morgan Piotrovsky scored after tagging up, Lilly Ciesielski singled, scoring two runs, and an error scored one run. Kayla Widner earned the win for Linden. The righty gave up one hit and zero runs over seven innings, striking out 18 and walking two. Sydney Rhoton took the loss for Midland. The starting pitcher went five innings, surrendering seven runs (three earned) on seven hits, striking out five and walking two. Maggie Frazee led Midland Varsity Chemics with one hit in three at bats.

In game two, Addie Edwards collected three hits in four at bats, as the Chemics defeated Linden Varsity Eagles 6-4 on Saturday. Edwards singled in the sixth inning, singled in the first inning, and singled in the fifth inning. Midland didn't take the lead until later in the game. The game was tied at four in the bottom of the sixth when Edwards singled, scoring two runs. The Eagles were the first to get on the board in the first when an error scored one run. Midland answered scoring on a wild pitch which tied the game at one in the bottom of the first. Linden took the lead in the top of the third. Morgan Piotrovsky grounded out, scoring two runs, to give Linden Varsity Eagles the upper hand, 3-1. Tessa Zilisch stepped in the circle first for L. The right-handed pitcher allowed seven hits and four runs (one earned) over four and two-thirds innings, striking out two and walking one. Sydney Rhoton threw one inning of no-run ball for the Chemics earning the save. Emily Wendt collected two hits for Midland Varsity Chemics in three at bats. The Chemics travel to Mt. Pleasant on Monday.

JV Soccer: The Chemics were in a tournament in Portage this Saturday. Their first opponent, Dewitt, proved to be a very tenacious team to handle. During the first half, Chemics were constantly under pressure with the Dewitt team being more aggressive and moving the ball well around the pitch. The Chemics had very few opportunities to score but managed with a bit of grit and luck to keep the score even at halftime. The second half proved to be more evenly matched with a game intensity raising up from both sides (and a couple of yellow cards given, one for each team). The efforts from Dewitt paid off with a goal with 18 minutes left in the game. The Chemics kept fighting adversity and on an ultimate offense with only 1 minutes left in the game, Hannah Murtha was fouled in the penalty box. Zoe Steger converted the penalty kick and the chemics got away with a tie in a very exciting game.

For the second game of the Portage tournament, the Chemics battled Vicksburg. The Chemics started the game strong with three goals in the first 7 minutes of the game: Maggie Spears assisted by Aubrey Jarosiewicz and two goals from Mollie Russell. The rest of the first half will show good ball movement for the Chemics, leaving little opportunities to Vicksburg. Three more goals were scored in the last 12 minutes in the first half: Eden Velt assisted by Finley Pickering, Emmie Osteyn assisted by Eden Velt and Charlie Bluemer unassisted. Half-time: 6-0 Chemics The second half proved to be similar in intent and the chemics closed out the game within 6 minutes with goals from Reagan Fales and Khloe Eyre. Final score 8-0 The Chemics will be on the field again this Wednesday @ Flint Powers.
