# 2023-2024 Budget Development

- October 17: Board of Education approved Budget Development Schedule (tentative)
- December 2022 March 2023: Meetings (formal and informal) held with CSA,
  Maintenance Coordinator, Technology Support Personnel, Child Study Team
  members, etc. to determine staffing needs, student placement
  recommendations/enrollment projections, facility/maintenance priorities, technology
  needs (student/staff level); Fixed costs (employee benefits, district insurances,
  transportation, utilities, leases, etc.) incorporated into projected budget
- February 28: Governor Murphy's Budget Message
- March 2: State Aid figures released

\$296,221 increase in Equalization Aid (\$5,891) decrease in School Choice Aid \$92,128 increase in Preschool Expansion Aid



- March 15: Board of Education approved the preliminary budget for submission to the County Office of Education (Budget submitted by March 20 deadline)
- April 4: Budget review held with Executive County School Business
   Official Questions/Discussion/Feedback; Revisions (not financially related)
- April 19: Budget officially approved by the County Office of Education
- May 8: Public Hearing & final adoption of budget by Board of Education

## 2023 - 2024 Budget Accomplishments ...

#### Adequate Staffing for Instructional Support

- Continued employment of additional Special Education Teacher (from ESSER Grant
   → General Fund Budget)
- Special Areas Continued employment of PT Art (shared), Music, Spanish (shared) and Health teachers for grades K-8
- Continued agreement with Quinton Township School for shared Mental Health Counselor (more time at ETS) and shared Trauma Informed Coordinator
- New: Employment of a Reading Specialist for enhanced student support

#### Continuation of Academic Programs

- Maintain small class sizes
- Kindergarten Eighth grades (1 class per grade level)
- School Choice District
- Year 2 of Preschool Program housed at Quinton Township School (PEA Grant funding)

#### Building Professionalism

- Continue to provide training for teachers and administration on the Danielson Evaluation Model and the OnCourse platform
- Provide mentoring for first year teachers
- Provide Professional Development opportunities on various topics, subject areas, support as needed including (General Fund Budget & Title IIA Grant funding):
  - Through OnSpire and OnCourse for teachers falling in the ineffective and/or partially effective range
  - On the implementation of NJSLA
  - Differentiated Instruction with the utilization of centers for instruction
  - In the areas of ELA and Mathematics
  - i-Ready supports
  - Curriculum revisions

- Improve academic outcomes for all students and ensure student engagement and student support by strengthening comprehensive curriculum, instruction, and assessment systems in the district
- Continue focus on organizing the classrooms for a variety of learning opportunities that encourage both whole group and small group activities
- Provide materials that support instruction and make them accessible for all types of learners
- Continue to update all areas of the curriculum to meet current NJ Student Learning Standards
- Maintain i-Ready curriculum supports and i-Ready assessment

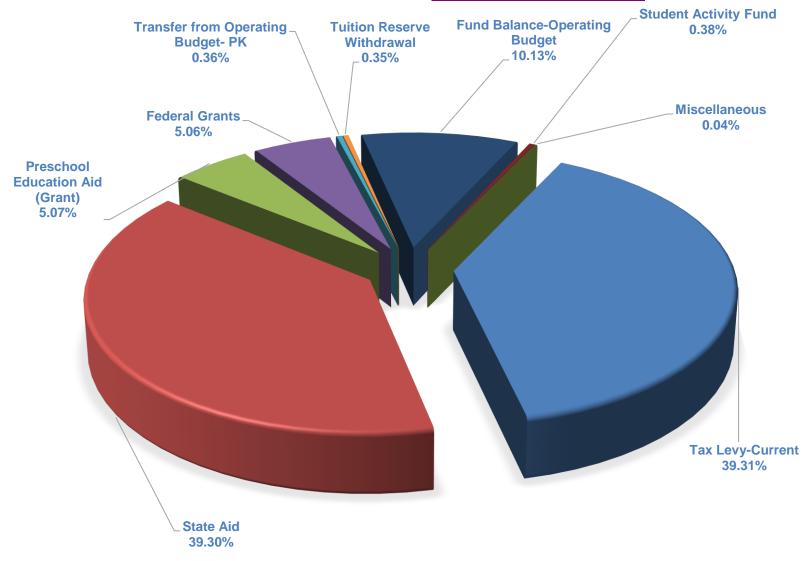

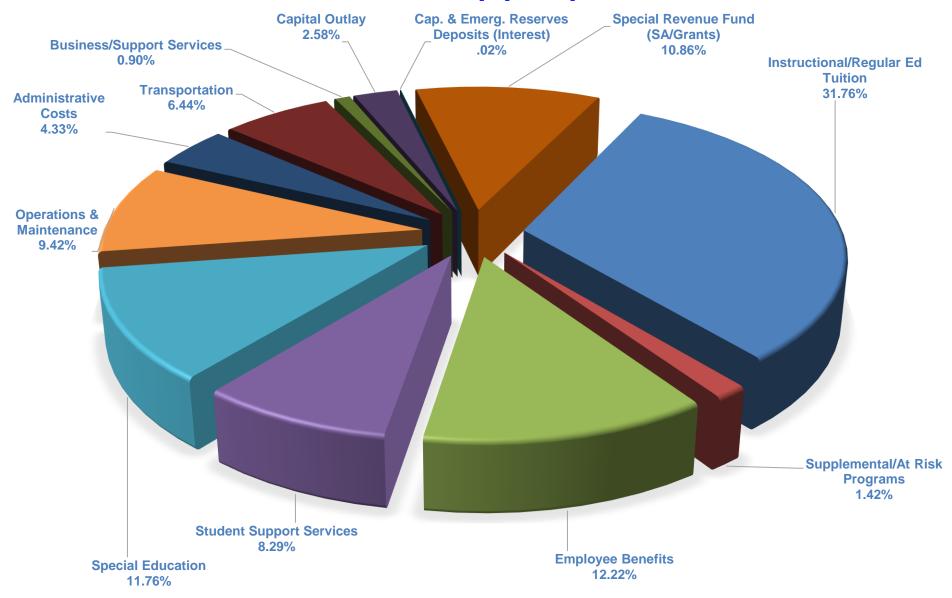
