



Assistant Principals' Message~




Your time here will fly by much faster than you think, so please take the time to enjoy the experience, make memories, and always remember, "Once a Jet, Always a Jet!"




Basketball

seniors.
















Algebra Basics







one could tell, they did a wonderful job of it.



about home life, school work, and outside activities. Seeing their smiling faces everyday makes me feel like I am doing my job right by making them happy."






Spending so much time preparing for per-

"Theatre has shown me that I have to be very responsible with my time and resources. Keeping my grades up along with knowing my lines is a lot of work!" said Madison Hicks.


