Please remember that Read-a-Thon logs are due, filled out and signed every Friday this month. I will place new logs in Boomerang Folders on Monday mornings.



Cispus is just around the corner! Can you believe we leave in only four weeks!?

It's not too late to fill out a medication authorization form! If your student takes regular medication (even over the counter) they must have this form filled out and signed. The medical provider can use their own form or letterhead, as long as it includes the 9 components on the back of the form: date, name of student, drug name, reason for the medication, strength of medicine, how much to give, when to give, duration of order, side effects to watch for, the provider's signature, and the parent's signature to authorize staff to give.

Please deliver medication to the school as soon as possible and in its original container so that our nurse can verify the medication and deliver it to the nurse who will be going to Cispus with us.
