

Honors or Advanced Placement Unit According to the University of California guidelines, an extra point is given for Honors (H) and Advanced Placement (AP) classes for 10<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup> graders only.

Tenth grade students may receive the extra point if they take junior or senior Honors or AP classes, but only for calculating their GPA for PVHS.
