Approximately four months ago, we had a young mother call the church and ask for help with groceries. She and her husband are parents of an 8-year-old boy, and a 10-year-old girl, and she told us that they had faced a tragedy about two weeks prior. Their little boy, who was taking medication for seizures, was swinging on the swing in their back yard when he had a seizure. The rope on the swing broke, wrapped around his neck, and killed him. She further stated that they had managed to save a little but, because she wanted him to have a nice funeral, it took all of their savings for the funeral and, now, they have no money for food. With your food pantry donations, we were able to provide the family with groceries. Most recently, the same mother called and asked for help with a delinquent power bill. After verifying with Alabama Power, and with your monetary support, we pledged to pay the bill which avoided a disconnect of their electric service.
