## As a reading scholar, when I read an informational text, <u>I can identify the author's purpose</u>.

Informational texts give information or facts about REAL people, things, or events. Most informational texts are written for one or more of these three purposes. Check the purpose(s) that best match the book that YOU are reading!

The author is writing to persuade for or against something.

As you read, notice if the author is giving you information that may change your knowledge and/or feelings about a topic, problem, or a situation.

The author is writing to inform.

As you read, notice if the author organizes the information within paragraphs, charts, graphs, or photos.

The author is writing to tell a story.


As you read, notice if the author organizes the information within a story format with characters, setting, plot and story ending.




## I notice that authors use one or more of these five text structures to organize information.

**1. Description:** The author provides details, explanations, and examples to share information and persuade.




**2. Sequences information:** The author sequences steps, dates, events, and evidence to support an idea.




**3. Cause/Effect:** The author describes something that happened and what will happen next.



**4. Compare/Contrast:** The author shows how things are alike and different.



**5. Problem/Solution:** The author explains a problem and talks about solutions.






