Class History

1944-45

Bravely marching into the hallowed halls of LWHS were 108 very green freshmen who entered the ninth grade in September. At their first "gathering of the clan," Miss Hattie Breedin was chosen as sponsor to direct them through their coming "trials 'n tribulations." Officers were Frank Thullbery, president; Betty Turner, vice-president; and Jeff Jones, secretary-treasurer.

On the "unlucky" night of Friday the 13th in the month of October, the ambitious group gave out with their first celebration. They sponsored a "Good Luck" dance in the gym after the Auburndale game. Gay decorations of four leaf clovers were used to carry out the theme.

By popular vote, Virginia McClure and Frank Thullbery were chosen to represent the frosh in the May Court. Later on that month, the class entertained their sister class, the juniors, at the annual picnic at Crystal Lake Park. Everyone enjoyed swimming, games, AND (most important) good food.

1945-46

A little bolder (and more experienced), 86 new sophomores began their second year with the election of officers. They were Ellis Hunt, president; Betty Turner, vice-president; Jewell Chastain, secretary; and Katharine Martin, treasurer. Marianne Gillen and Bobby Kenney were chosen to help cheer them to their victories.

On November 2, the class gave a hilarious carnival at the gym where unique and unusual booths, gaily decorated with various hues of crepe paper, attracted many of the adventurous guests.

Marching ever forward, the class was the first to sponsor a magazine sale for the Curtis Publishing Company with a net result that \$123.00 was cleared on the project.

For the May Festival in the Open Air Theater, Marianne Gillen was escorted by Ellis Hunt. The last social event of a highly successful year was the picnic at Kissengen Springs on May 24 with seniors as honored guests.

1946-47

September 1946 opened a busy and never to be forgotten year for the class of 82 "jolly juniors". Ellis Hunt was again elected president and assisting him were Dick Chandley, vice-president; Betty Turner, secretary; and Frank Thullbery, treasurer. Cheerleaders chosen by the entire student body were Jean Rogers and Bobby Kenney. Miss June Dixon became co-sponsor to assist Miss Breedin.



Clearing \$53.00 on the sale of season football tickets, the group went on to sell hot dogs, cold drinks, and popcorn at the home football games.

After the Homecoming game, the "ever ambitious" group gave a "Harvest Festival" dance at the Woman's Club. One of the year's highlights was the production of the class play, "They Gave Him a Coed" on February 18. Who could ever forget Ellis Hunt as Dean (Chemquassabamticook) Brown or Eddie Pooser, ("I'm a mummy, all wrapped up and no place to go") in that uproarious comedy! Other members of the cast included: Dick Chandley, Warren Delmar, Edwin Friedlander, Marianne Gillen, Mary Neil Hardman, Peggy Horton, Bobby Johnson, Betty Turner, Dottie Sherman, Frank Thullbery, Betty Ann Roth, Frank Webb, Lee Wester, and Marianne Williams.

THE event of the year was held on May 9 when the juniors entertained the seniors at the annual Junior-Senior Banquet at the Walesbilt Hotel. Since "The Big Top" was the theme of the festivities, the huge dining room was gaily decorated with balloons, clowns, side-show freaks, etc. The prom and dance followed at the Country Club.

Eighteen of the class became members of the Honor Society; 15 boys went out for football. Marianne Williams and Dick Chandley were chosen as junior representatives in the May Court.

The freshmen entertained the class with a feast and swimming party at Kissengen Springs on May 23.

1947-48

After three wonderful and exciting fun-packed years, 69 "sophisticates" began the "last mile" on the road of their high school education. This has been recorded in detail in this, their endeavor, the 1947-48 Crown Jewel.

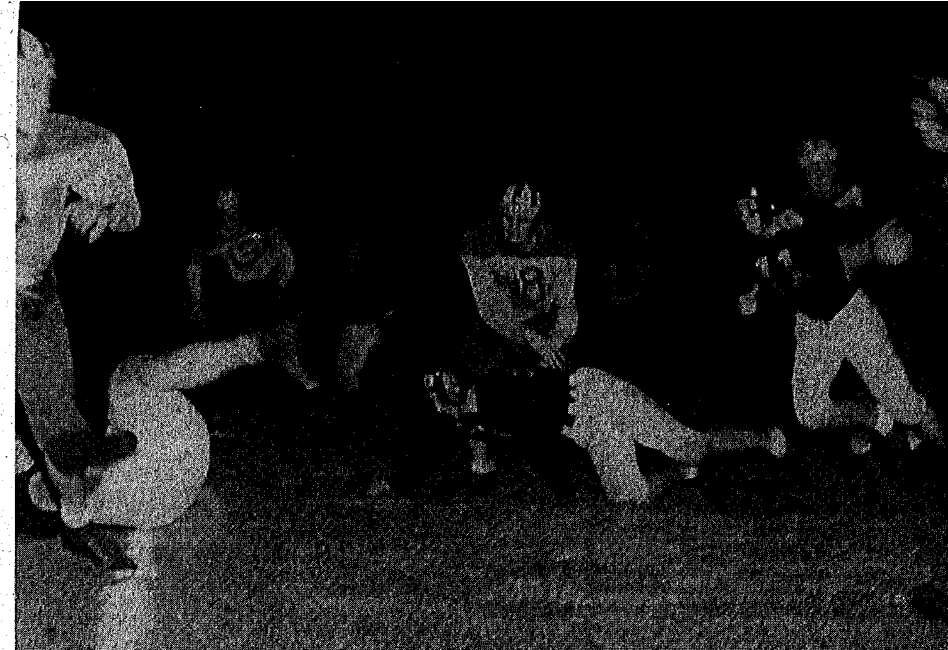


**Here Fort Meade 26-0

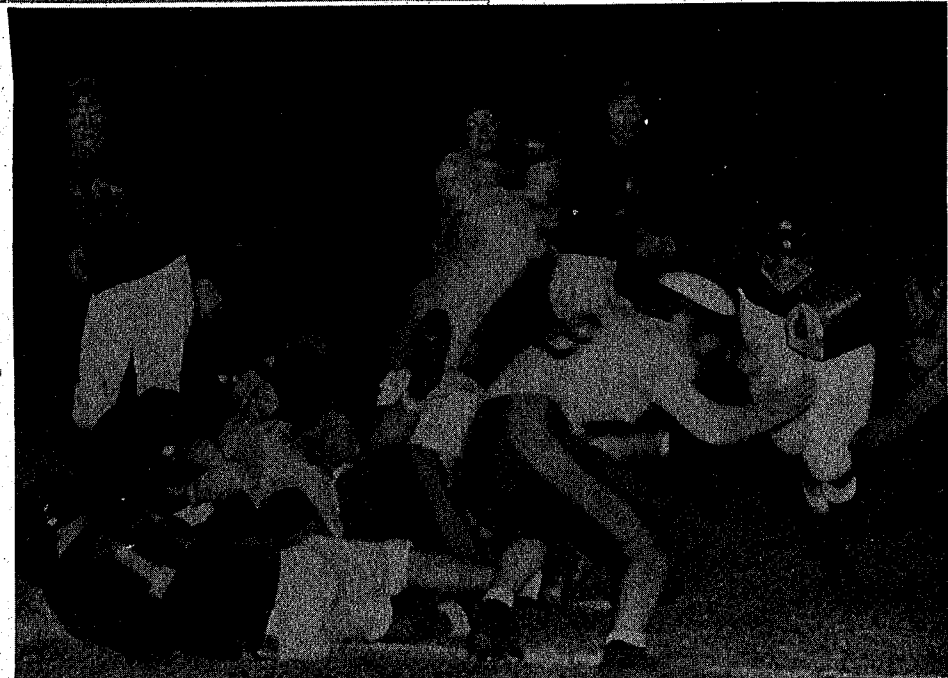
**There Mulberry 13-0

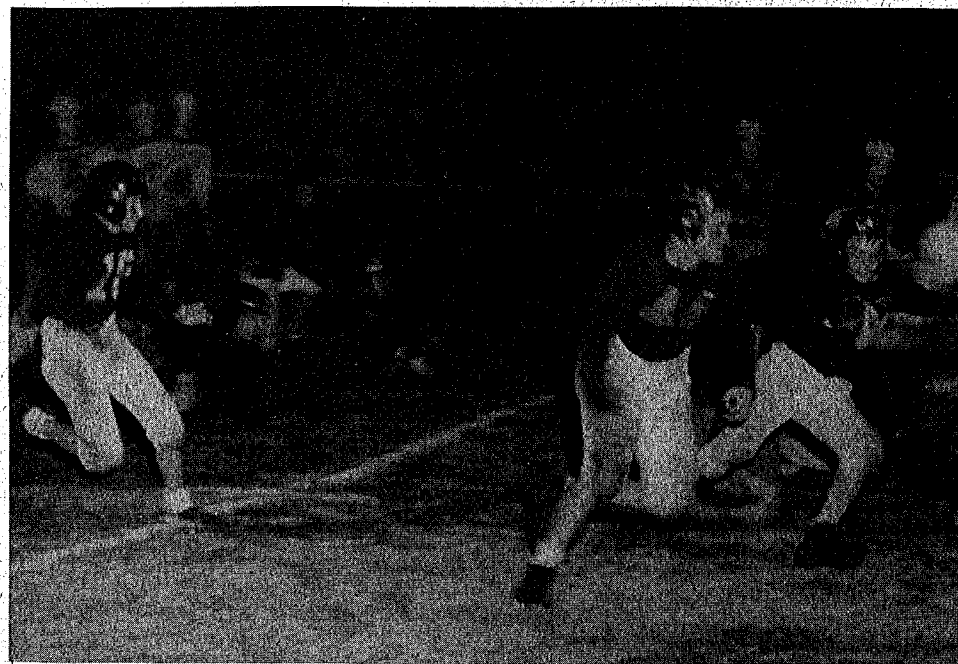
**Here St. Leo 20-7

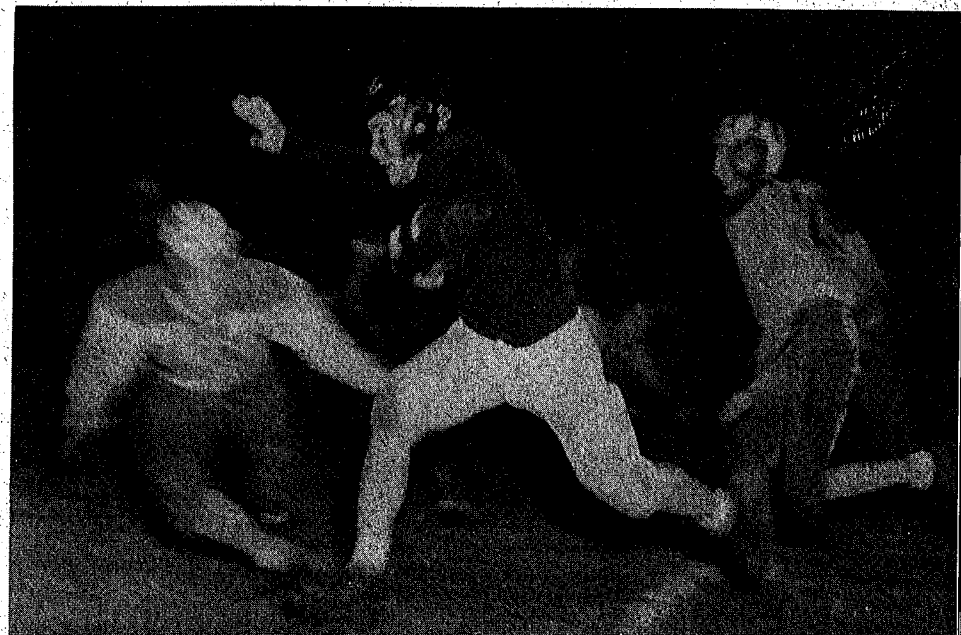
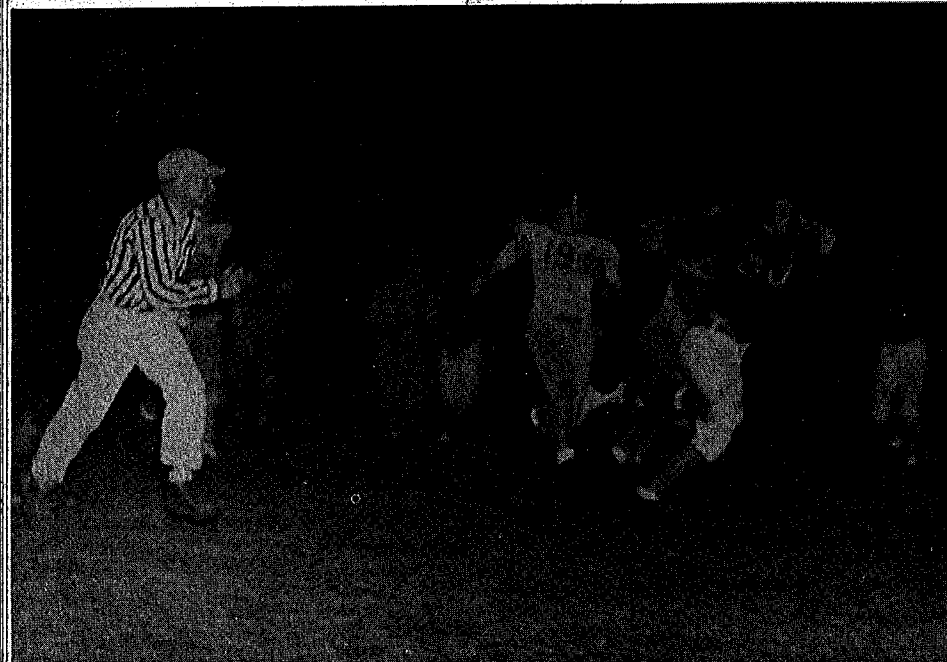


**There Sebring 26-0

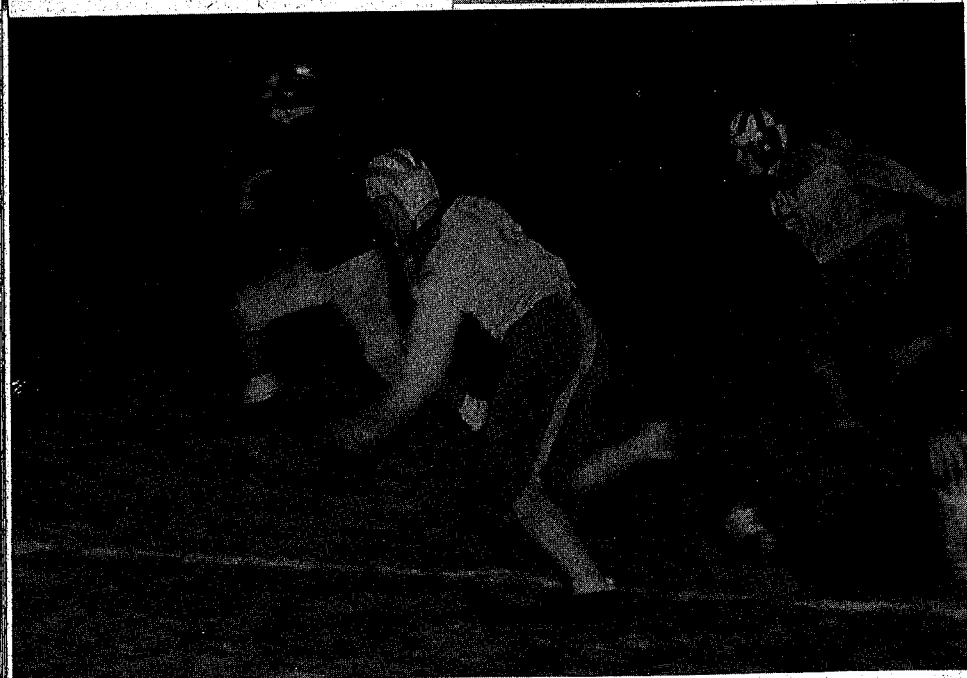
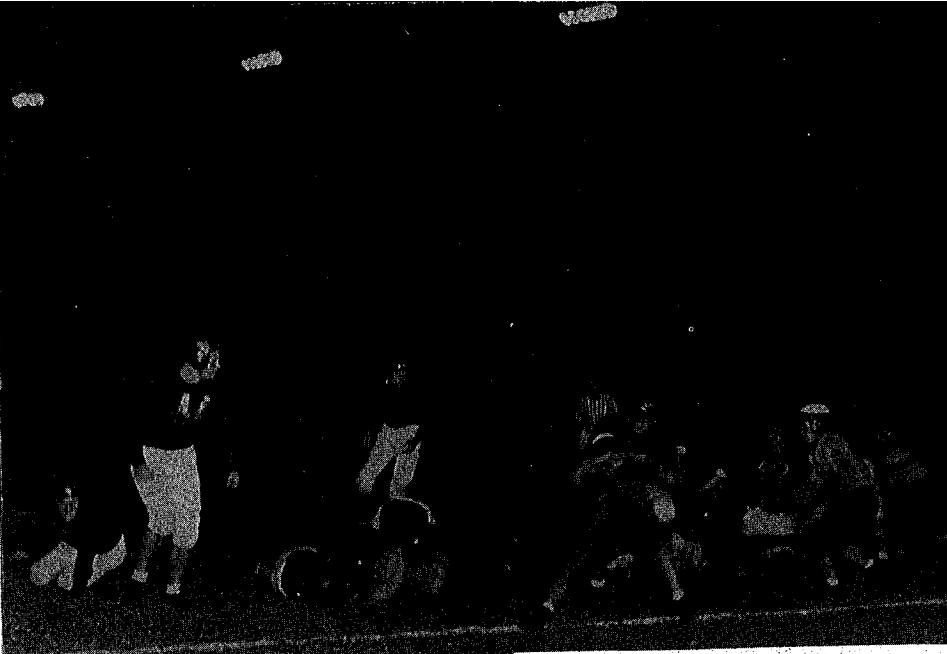
**Here Kissimmee 38-6

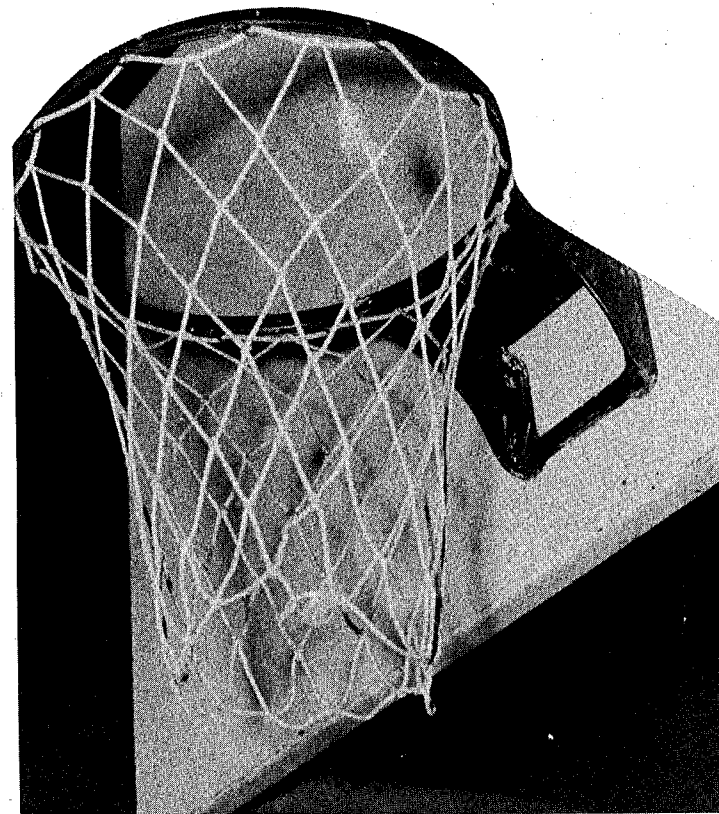
**Here Haines City 0-6
