Bicycle Safety

On Thursday, September 25th all students were visited by two Demarest Police officers to discuss bicycle, e-bicycle, and pedestrian safety. Students were reminded that they:

- Are legally obligated to wear a helmet while riding a scooter or bicycle.
- Must follow the instructions of the crossing guard
- Must follow the rules of the road when operating an electric powered bicycle or scooter on the street

DEMAREST MIDDLE SCHOOL HALLOWEEN

Students will be allowed to wear their costumes for the full school day on Friday, October 31st. They should come to school in their costumes and will remain in their costumes for the entirety of the day.

Costumes should adhere to the following guidelines as detailed below.

- Students are reminded that if they are planning to wear a costume to school for Halloween, it must conform to The Demarest Middle School Dress Code.
- Costumes may not be demeaning, insulting, or representing any ethnic group, race, nationality, disability, gender (boys as girls and vice versa), individual (staff or student) at the school, or depict any religious leaders as that may be offensive to other students.
- Costumes may not cause a disruption or distraction to the school program. For example, no revealing costumes such as: nightwear, bathing suits, etc.
- No weapons or props replicating weapons or dangerous items are to be brought to school.
- No costumes are allowed that would completely hide the identity of the student, i.e. gorilla suit, "Scream" character, or a costume mask. **(Costume Masks are not permitted).**
- No costumes are allowed that would impair a student's vision or movement.
- No costumes showing obscene materials or prohibited substances are allowed.
- No inflatable costumes.
- No products such as makeup or hairspray should be brought to school.
