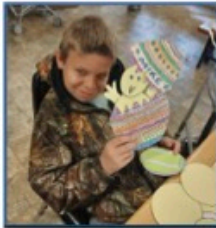

## God Called... We Followed

As hard as writing Newsletters is for me, sometimes it's nice to sit back and think of the last 50+ years. From being told we would never be able to have children to being surrounded by 100s, probably 1,000s, of children over the years. Some of them here for just a short period and others for a lifetime. That doesn't make a difference in whether they would be considered "ours."

My how God has blessed us! People say all the time how we are such a blessing to those that enter our doors, but they don't know how full our hearts are because of all those that have entered. When Sandy and I married in 1963, I never envisioned that we would settle in central Kentucky on 20 acres that would be home to our mentally and physically handicapped, to babies while their moms were incarcerated, to children and adults from foreign countries seeking medical attention that they couldn't receive in their home countries, to children who just needed a place to call "home," to a Christian

Academy that hasn't stopped growing, or to this 81-year-old man from the Big "D" and I don't mean Dallas.

Though Sandy was called home nearly 15 years ago, her visions and God's calling on our lives still shine bright each and every day. Just ask anyone who is here daily and sees Robbie and Levi working here on our property helping keep things neat and tidy. Or sees our Girl's dorm bunch assisting in the Blessing House and doing laundry. Or catches a glimpse of our wonderful volunteers running a daycare-like program for our handicapped through the week that entails lots of singing, crafts, and smiling faces. Or watches how excited George gets about helping anyone do anything. Or can only see the smile in James' face as he sips on a cup of coffee and asks for a "shnackie."

And although 9/11 put a halt to receiving children from foreign countries and it is no longer something we do, some of our lifelong family and fondest memories include children, adults now, that we would have never

come to know had the Lord not placed that ministry on Sandy's heart. And because of that, what could have been a hard life as a handicapped in a foreign country for some, is now a flourishing, successful life here in the states that includes full time work, marriages, and children of their own for most of them.

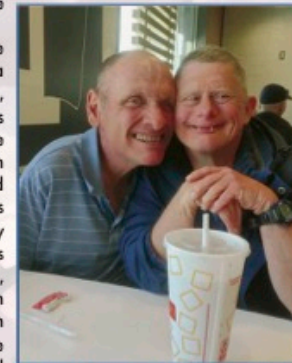
Off campus, two of Sandy's dreams are still making an impact on our community and the Galilean Home. The Liberty Trading Post where we sell any donated items that we can't use here, allows for extra money to come into the Home while also providing those around us with affordable clothing, furniture, etc.

And the Bread of Life Café is still the best restaurant in Kentucky if you ask me. Like the Trading Post, all proceeds go to the Galilean Home. Serving on average 2,800-3,000 customers a week, the Café is also the perfect platform to tell people about our ministry. We employ about 60 people at our restaurant. Over the years, we've

had several of our handicapped children "work" at the restaurant. We've always felt it was important for them to have a sense of purpose in life. Whether they're helping at the restaurant, working on our campus, making rag rugs, quilting, they each have something they enjoy doing and that makes them feel like they are needed.

I hope you guys enjoy all of these pictures that range from when it all started to now. Oh, the memories that have come flooding back going through all of these photos. If only there was enough time in a day and a way to send a voice recording in a Newsletter so that I could give you guys the full stories behind them all! My cup runneth over! And we wouldn't have been able to make, or continue to make, the memories that we have if it weren't for the Good Lord and our supporters believing in what we do here.
