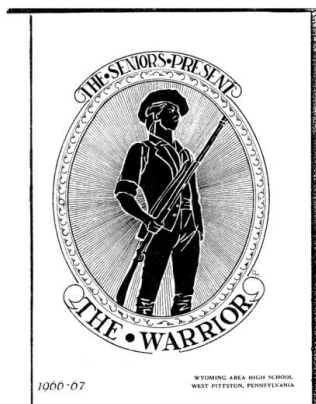


David J. Williams III Memorial Scholarship "The WARRIOR Award"

This Award has been established, by the Williams family, in memory of the late David J. Williams, III who was a member of the first graduating class of Wyoming Area Class of 1967. It was his commitment to the ideals and traditions established by his class of 1967 for which this award has been created.



Staying true to their class motto "I will either find or make a way" The Class of 1967 was the melding of 4 different schools into one district dedicated to the advancement of educational excellence, scholastic achievement and community involvement. The gold, green and white became the colors to reckon with as "Hail Wyoming Area" was sung in unison by once competing schools.

The Warrior, presented by the first graduating class, was to be used as the centerpiece of the new school. It helped develop its roots, set the ideals and traditions, which all future classes must strive to, maintain and preserve.

Applicant must be a Wyoming Area graduating senior who has been accepted to any accredited trade school, technical college, community college or 4 year college/university.

Essay Required: In a solid essay of at least 500 words, describe the significance of being awarded the David J. Williams III Memorial Scholarship and specifically describe what you have done to help Wyoming Area continue the traditions and ideals set by the Class of 1967.
