2.1. Principal's Report/Student Achievement

3.1. Approve Monthly Budget Report

Rationale:

November 2022 Budget Report

General Fund

Revenue receipts through November totaled nearly \$697,000.

Local Revenue: \$61,000 has been collected in utilities tax, while nearly \$13,000 was received in motor vehicle taxes. \$4,200 was received for reimbursement of expenses, while \$4,100 was received in refunds of prior year expenditures. \$3,300 was received for delinquent property taxes.

State Revenue: \$603,000 was received in SEEK funding. \$2,700 was received for revenue in lieu of taxes from the state.

Federal Revenue: \$4,500 was received for Medicaid reimbursement.

Expenditures through November totaled \$750,000.

School Budget: The school budget is \$27,413. Nearly \$10,600 was expended through November. Expenses included \$3,000 for technology resources and \$3,000 on general supplies, \$2,800 on copier fees, and \$1,000 on dues and fees.

Maintenance Budget: Expenses totaled \$140,000 through November. Expenses included \$44,000 on property insurance, \$36,000 on utility services, \$34,000 on salaries and benefits, \$15,000 on general supplies, \$7,500 on repairs and maintenance, \$3,000 on professional services, and \$600 machinery. 43% of the maintenance budget has been utilized.

Transportation Budget: Through November, costs totaled \$50,000. Salaries and benefits accounted for \$17,000. \$11,000 has been spent on vehicles (Suburban payment), while annual fleet insurance was \$6,300. \$8,000 has been spent on diesel fuel/gasoline. \$5,300 has been expended on repair parts and tires. Professional services/drug testing accounted for \$1,000, while \$900 has been spent on vehicle repair. 43% of the transportation budget has been utilized.

For the general fund, year-to-date expenditures exceeded receipts by \$52,000.

Special Revenue Fund

Nothing to report.

Food Service Fund

Revenue: \$4,700 was received in local revenue. \$72,000 was received for federal reimbursement. Food service started with a balance of \$89,000.

Expenditures: Expenses totaled \$87,000 through November including \$43,000 on salaries and benefits, \$37,000 on food supplies, \$3,400 on machinery, \$1,500 on dues and fees, \$900 on technology supplies, and \$700 on equipment repair.

The food service balance as of November 30 was approximately \$80,000.
