




ESPORTS

Tri-Township’s first year competing in the Indiana Esports Network has been nothing short of outstanding. Our students have competed in Tetris, Chess, Fortnite, Mario Kart, iRacing, and NBA 2K.

Several of our players have earned their place and are ranked in the top 40 in both Tetris (Landon Pitts and Gryphon Partridge) and Chess (Aiden Duvall).

Ty Sykora earned an invitation to the iRacing All-Star Race following strong early-season performances.

Breckon Ramirez finished #1 overall in the NBA 2K tournament earlier this month and will compete in the live championship round in Indianapolis on the 29th at Gambridge Fieldhouse. A large group of our Esports team and students will travel to Indianapolis to cheer Breckon on, participate in a college and career fair, and attend a Pacers game — an incredible opportunity to celebrate student success both inside and outside the arena.

What makes this even more impressive is that this is our first year as a program. In just one season, we have secured community sponsors, purchased new equipment, and built competitive teams across multiple titles offered by IEN.

As state playoffs begin next week, we are proud of the discipline, teamwork, and sportsmanship our students have shown all season long. This is just the beginning for Tri-Township Esports.

We’re also incredibly proud of our Tri-Township High Schoolers Rain Skidmore, James McDowell, and Caitlin Connor, who earned a spot in the finals of the 2026 Indiana Personal Finance Challenge State Competition in Indianapolis.

While we didn’t bring home the championship, our students delivered a strong case study presentation, represented our school with professionalism, and connected with top teams from across Indiana. They also had the opportunity to hear from and meet our Indiana Secretary of State, Diego Morales.

We’re very proud of how they competed and worked together — and we’re already looking forward to coming back stronger next year.
