



First Grade

First Grade is diving head-first into preparations for Second Grade. The students are beginning to read and understand assignment directions on their own. This is not an easy transition. Some students are experiencing frustration, confusion, and moments of "I just give up," but they are also experiencing accomplishments, encouraging each other, and proud moments of "I can do this." We are encouraging our students to continue Reading 20 minutes at home every day. The First Graders are taking their learned math computation skills and will be applying them to double-digit addition and subtraction, and solving word problems using the CUBES method all while working independently. The students are using text evidence to respond in complete sentences to questions in ELA, Social Studies, and Science.

Second Grade

Second grade is moving along toward 3rd grade. We will be learning about and writing our own biographies and opinion essays in reading and writing. We will be learning about rules and responsibilities in Social Studies. In Science, we will be learning about natural and man made resources.

Please ensure your child is present and on time daily. We are continuing to learn new standards and review previously taught standards in Math and ELA. Encourage your child to ask questions if they don't understand something. Completing homework weekly is imperative in 3rd grade. Parents continue to sign your child's agenda and reading log nightly.

Also, schedule a conference with your child's teacher before Spring Break (March 13-17) to ensure all parties are aware of the student's academic progress and testing scores. We need parental assistance in creating action plans for student success. Thank you for your continued support.



In math, we are working on multipling fractions. In ELA, we are moving through Unit 4: We are learning about adventures, our government with narrative nonfiction, space exploration with historical fiction, and poetry to end it. In science, we are learning about energy and blasting off into Earth and space. With social studies, we are learning about the branches of government in both state and federal, and the Civil War and Reconstruction. We have our no cost field thrip on the 3rd and permission slips for our end of year field trip will be coming home soon.

Fifth Grade

In Fifth Grade for the month of March in Math, students will be learning to divide fractions, classify figures and understand volume. We are continuously practicing our math facts and encourage students and their families to practice them at home. In ELA, we are working on reading and understanding drama, analyzing figurative language, and how characterization contributes to the plot of literary texts. We are continuously working on affixes. Please look on your child's classroom newsletter for the weekly suffixes, prefixes, and vocabulary words. Students should be reading at least 20 minutes a day and recording a summary in their reading logs. In Science and Social Studies, we are completing our "Sharing the Planet" unit. We are moving into our unit that focuses on physical properties of matter, mixtures and solutions, and energy. As a reminder, the Seaworld field trip permission slip and money are due by April 30 th . The permission slip must be notarized. Please feel free to use our notaries in the front office.

Why Offer Primary Years Programme (PYP) IB

As we approach the fourth quarter and continue with the PYP IB program, we want to share several specific ways you can support your child. Here are the six most important ways to support them at home:





- 1. Take an inquiry stance: As the leading strategy teachers use, all teachers at JHW take an inquiry stance. What does this mean for parents? Here are a few things to do and resources to access.
- 2. Reflect together: The PYP framework builds in time for reflection for students to be aware of their effort and identify specific ways to improve in the future; it is also part of our approaches to learning (ATL) under thinking skills to reflect on the process of learning. Here are some ideas for you:
- 3. Support agency: The PYP define agency as, "the power to take meaningful and intentional action, and acknowledges the rights and responsibilities of the individual, supporting voice, choice and ownership for everyone in the learning community." How can you help with this?
- 4. Give feedback: Feedback is one of the most effective tools we have as teachers. It moves students forward by considering, "What's my next step?" There is always a next step in learning and we need to help learners identify what this is. Here are a few ideas:
- 5. Extend concepts: In the PYP, we have a carefully designed, intention concept-based curriculum. Concepts are powerful, broad and abstract organizing ideas that build understandings across, between and beyond subjects. How can you extend these at home?
- 6. Live the learner profile: If you want to choose one area to focus on first, this would be it! Supporting the learner profile attributes is a key way to support your child. You can help by first understanding all 10 attributes, using these words in conversations with your child and living the learner profile through your words and actions.

You have the right to request the following:

- o The teacher's Florida certification area(s) and,
 - If the teacher is teaching infield or is qualified according to Lake Wales Charter Schools.
 - If the teacher has met state licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
 - o If the teacher is teaching under temporary, emergency, or other provisional status OR has been teaching for less than four years.
 - If a teacher has received a summative performance evaluation rating of unsatisfactory per s. 1012.34, F.S., Personnel evaluation procedures and criteria.
- The instructional qualifications of any instructional paraprofessional who provides services to your child.

You will be notified in writing if your child has been assigned or has been taught four consecutive weeks or more by a teacher who does not meet applicable State certification or licensure requirements at the grade level and subject area in which the teacher has been assigned [ESSA 1111(g)(1)(B, 1111(h)(5)(D), and 1112(e)(1)(B)(ii)]. The information regarding the qualifications of your child's teacher and/or classroom paraprofessionals may be obtained from your child's principal.

In addition, your child's school will provide information on the level of achievement of your child on state academic assessments. This information will be available at your child's school.

Please be assured that Lake Wales Charter Schools is dedicated to providing your child(ren) a quality education. If you would like to receive any of this information, please contact your child's school.



MARCH MADNESS Are We Ready JHW???


