
As we prepare to embark on another year of "Building Lives for Eternity," I am humbled as I look back on how

The theme of reflection was continued and built upon at the commencement service on May 16. Class

strive for excellence, and be courageous.





When the campus was purchased in 1959, it consisted of three buildings: the Administration Building, Whittier Hall, and Hord Hall. Through the years, several new buildings have been constructed, and Whittier and Hord have been razed. The most recent project, completed in 2008, was the new high school building on the southwest edge of campus

Nebraska Christian Schools came into being through the grace of God and as a result of the prayer and effort by several godly men who desired to see a Christian high school in central Nebraska. Many of these men served on the Nebraska Christian Board in the school's early days.

Nebraska Christian would not have survived the last 50 years without the prayers and support of people who believe in Christian education. While most people think of monetary gifts in relation to supporting the school (and NC couldn't survive without those!), other donations are equally important. Electronics, sides of beef, sidewalks, musical instruments, lockers – all have been given to the school. But perhaps the most notable gifts, to many students at least, were potatoes. For many years, the potato dig at Floyd Rowse's field outside of Burwell was a highlight of the year. Keith Barthel provided the noon meal for the students, and if there was time, they'd head back to his farm once they finished collecting potatoes. The potatoes collected that day would be used in school meals throughout the year.




The 2008-2009 NC elementary.

For Nebraska Christian's first 12 years, it was solely a high school. In 1971, grades 7 and 8 were added to the student body. Then in 1977, the Nebraska Christian Elementary School was formed. Throughout the years, the elementary school moved repeatedly, as classes have been housed at the Central City Evangelical Free Church, the boys' dorm west wing, the girls' dorm north wing, and the classroom wing of the gym building. In the fall of 1999, the elementary moved to the recently purchased Marquette school, where it stayed until the fall of 2004. At that time, the school moved into the renovated bus barn on the main NC campus.

When Nebraska Christian opened, the boys lived in Hord Hall and the girls in Whittier. In 1962, West Hall, the current girls' dorm, was built, and East Hall, the current boys' dorm, followed in 1964. Initially, most students lived in the dorms during the week, but as time progressed, fewer families chose to have their children say in the dorms. By the late 1990s, NC had only a handful of dorm students. With the addition of the international program, however, the dorms again filled, and there will be 39 dorm students in '09-'10.

For decades, Nebraska Christian has welcomed students from other countries to be part of the student body. In the 1980s and 1990s, many Japanese students studied at NC, but only a few attended at a time. That all changed with the arrival of Dr. David Edgren in 2001. When Edgren became superintendent, he brought with him a vision for a thriving international program. Over the last eight years, the international program has grown steadily, and in the 2008-2009 school year, students from Japan, China, Taiwan, Vietnam, South Korea, and Hong Kong were members of the student body.

Student Summer Activities: From Sports Camps to Conferences





Walter Ediger, 1923 - 2009

BELLA VISTA — Walter Ediger, Christian educator, dies at 85.

Walter Ediger, known throughout the Midwest for his work in Christian high school administration, has died. He was 85.

Ediger, who lived in Bella Vista, died Friday, June 26, 2009, at Northwest Medical Center of complications of a stroke. He was born to Frank C. and Martha Ediger on Oct. 21, 1923, in Henderson, Neb., and spent his early years in Hillsboro, Kan., where he graduated from Hillsboro High School. He earned a B.A. degree from Tabor College in Hillsboro and later added an M.S. in educational administration from the Kansas State Teachers College in Emporia.

He married Wanda Pauls, his wife of 65 years, on May 27, 1944. The Edigers had five children: Warren, Karen, Paul, Christi, and Beth.

He began his teaching career at Berean Academy, then served as an administrator and teacher at Central Christian High School in Hutchinson, Kan., Nebraska Christian High School in Central City, Neb., and Oklahoma Bible Academy, Enid, Okla. He played a key role in the creation of Central Christian High School and Nebraska

Christian High School and was instrumental in helping Oklahoma Bible Academy build and move into new facilities in Enid. He was also active for many years on the Board of Directors of Grace University, in Omaha, Neb.

He was a frequent consultant to other Christian schools and speaker at Christian education conferences. The Association of Christian Schools International recognized him for his contribution to Christian education, and Nebraska Christian High School named him to their Hall of Faith for his work there. He wrote numerous articles and one book, "A Quest for Excellence in Christian Education."

He is survived by Wanda, Warren and Cheri Ediger, Karen and Phil Wantoch, Paul Ediger, Christi and Geoff Braun, and Beth and Miles Menne. He is also survived by his brother, Frank; 12 grandchildren; five greatgrandchildren; and many nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his younger brother, Joel.

The family suggests donating to a memorial fund established in his name at Grace University, 1311 South 9th St., Omaha, NE.

Sewer Project Update

In late June, we sent a letter to everyone who receives the Advance, informing them of our state-required sewer project. To date, 94 individuals or couples have contributed nearly \$41,000 to aid in the project. We are so grateful!
