

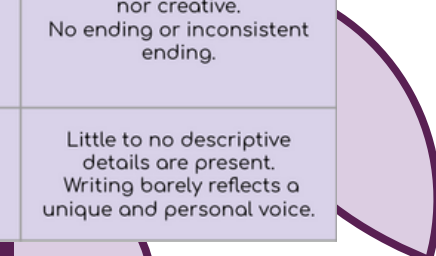
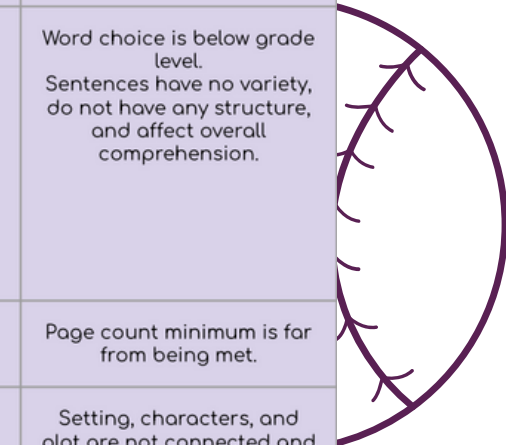
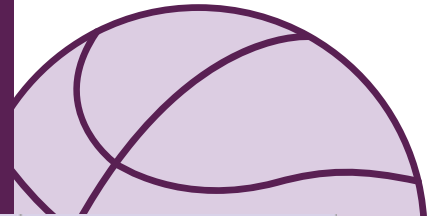
10TH GRADE SUMMER BOOK REPORT

Conventions	Spelling is correct throughout piece. Punctuation is used correctly. Format and presentation is correct/professional (Times New Roman, size 12, double spaced). Word choice is standard, but still appropriate. Sentences read smoothly but lack luster, structure, and variety. Dialogue is either not present, or not effectively incorporated.	Word choice is below grade level. Sentences have no variety, do not have any structure, and affect overall comprehension.
Page Count	Minimum page count is met.	Slightly below page count minimum.	Page count minimum is far from being met.
Ideas/ Organization / Content	Setting, characters, and plot are fully fleshed out, vibrant, and connected. Flow of action is logical and deliberate. Plot is original/ creative/ imaginative. Ending is effective, fitting, and provides a sense of completion.	Setting, characters, and plot are connected and somewhat creative. Plot is somewhat engaging, creative, and imaginative. Ending just about provides a sense of completion but without much creativity.	Setting, characters, and plot are not connected and heavily lack creativity. Plot is neither engaging nor creative.
