Please know that our teachers and staff are working diligently to instruct your child based on their strengths and needs, with input from their STAR assessment and classroom academic performance. Attendance counts... Attendance directly impacts academic achievement. State law requires students to attend 90% of all school days for promotion. If your child(ren) have three (3) consecutive or five (5) unexcused days absent, you will receive an Attendance Letter from our Attendance Clerk. Either medical excuses or up to 10 handwritten letters can be submitted by a parent to the Front Office. Tardies count, too! Please remember that school begins at 7:45 A.M. If a student arrives after that time, they are considered tardy, and you will have to sign them in at the front door.
