Reinstating Tenure

- Mrs. Kim Worley presented the Board with an overview of the science textbook adoption process. She explained that a committee of nominated teachers had thoroughly reviewed instructional materials and recommended the following for adoption: *McGraw Hill Tennessee Science* for grades K–5 and 9–12, and *SAVVAS Learning* for grades 6–8.Upon a motion by Carlos Doss and a second by Gleyn Twilla, the Board approved the adoption as recommended.
- STEM and Plus ONE students from Dyersburg Middle School presented an overview of the Kellan Project, where they are applying the engineering design process to develop a mechanism that will allow Kellan to participate in dodgeball with his classmates. The students shared their design approach, progress to date, and next steps for the project. They also reflected on their recent visit to the State Capitol, where they had the opportunity to share their work with legislators and learn more about state government.
- Students from Dyersburg Intermediate School and Dyersburg Middle School shared highlights from their recent participation in the SkillsUSA Competition. They spoke about their experiences, including the challenges they overcame and the victories they achieved during the event. The students expressed pride in representing their schools and emphasized the skills and confidence they gained through the competition.
- Coach Jerome Agnew shared an update on his class's second book publishing project. He expressed great pride in his students' accomplishments, noting that they have now written, illustrated, and published two books. Coach Agnew highlighted the high expectations set in his classroom and emphasized how each student consistently rises to meet those expectations, demonstrating creativity, dedication, and growth through the process.
- Mrs. Kim Worley presented the Board with a resolution related to the \$2,000 staff bonus. She explained that in order to receive funding from the state, the Board must formally pass the resolution. With a motion by Dr. Scott Self and a second by Carlos Doss, the resolution was approved on first reading. The second reading is scheduled for the May board meeting. It was expressed that every staff member would receive a bonus and that local funds would be used to supplement the amount funded from the State to ensure that all staff members receive the bonus.
