
While in line, junior Lauren Price says, "The fair is a chance to have fun and spend the week with friends."





Pep-rallies were usually full of excitement and response. The cheerleaders, band members, football players, coaches, student council and last but not least the fans were responsible for this.




While at the pep-rally, junior John Looney says, "It was a great chance to release stress and have a good time with friends."

During the pep-rally, senior Will Foster says, "It was the best homecoming I ever had, although I have had my fill of bananas now."



"Playing the part of Nora Watson was fun. She is a woman with lots of self-confidence and an attitude. May I be like her someday," says senior Tonya Elkins.











French teacher Jane Parris said her favorite quote from her students was, "How come those people don't talk the way we do?" Her answer, "Because we arrived later, they were here first."











made up the history department.



The theme of the 1994 Plateau, volume 31, is "Where do you fit in?" The 800 books ordered were printed by Jostens Printing & Publishing Co. in Clarksville, Tennessee. Each book contained 216 pages. The custom designed cover and backbone were craftline embossed, using Smoke 491 material, with flatscreen colors of Blue 349, and Yellow 339. A Cordova grain with a Black 326 rub was also applied. The cover typestyle was in various sizes 48 Benguiat Bold. The front and back endsheet were custom designed with a picture, logo, copy added in 13 Avant Garde, and senior names were in the design of the number 94.

The type was Style 13 Avant Garde, 37i Souvenir, 87 Ronda, and 74 Friz Quadrata. Optional typestyles included 52 University and 36i Serif Gothic Bold. Captions were set in 9 pt., body copy in 11 pt., main headlines in 42 pt., sub-headlines in 14 pt., folio tabs in 8 pt., and division page headlines in 42 pt.
