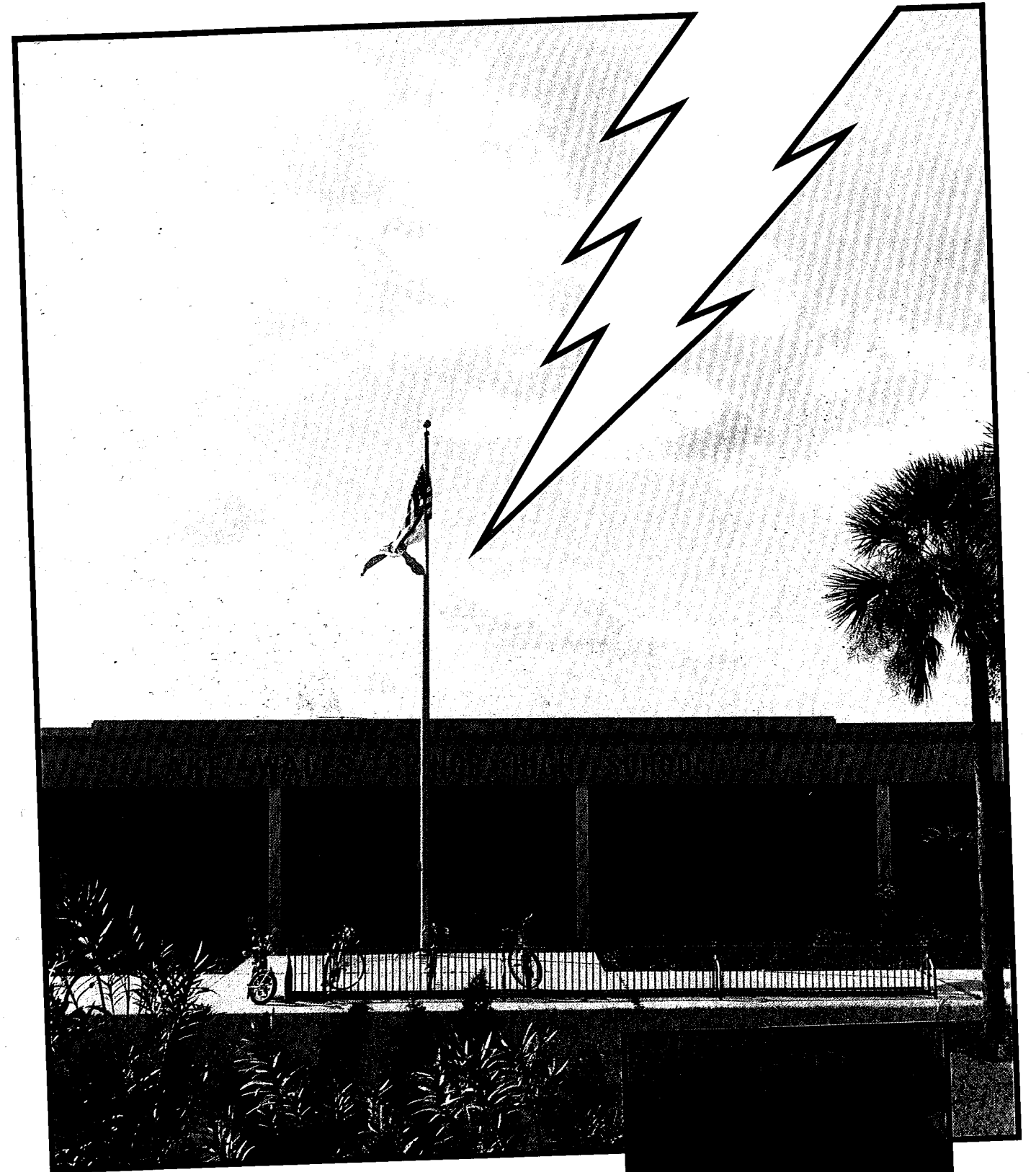

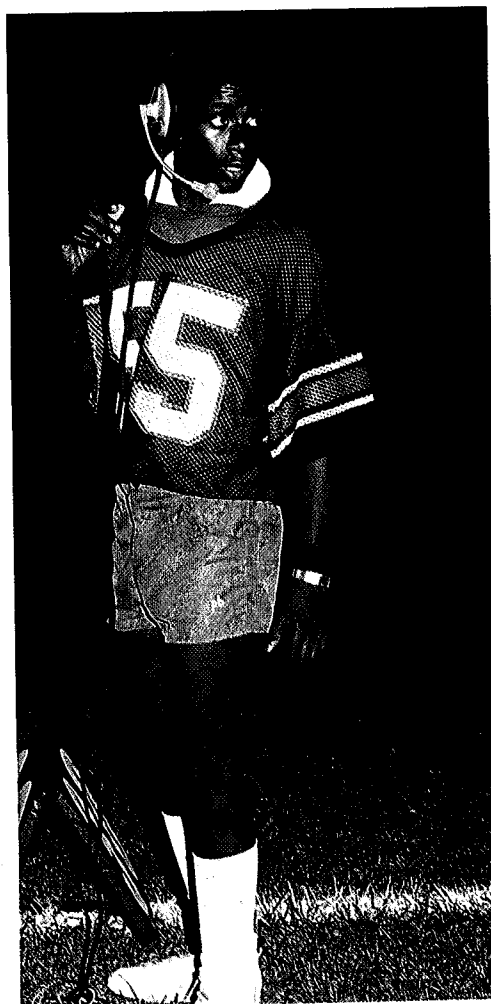
# State of Shock

# Mickey Comes to Town

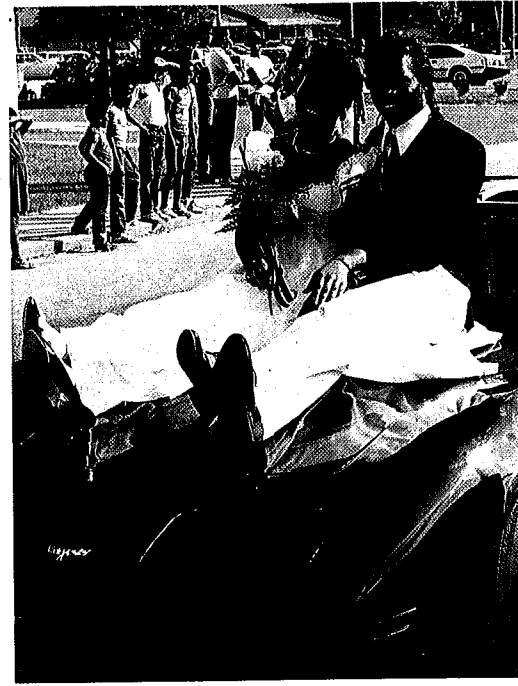

# I Make a Difference

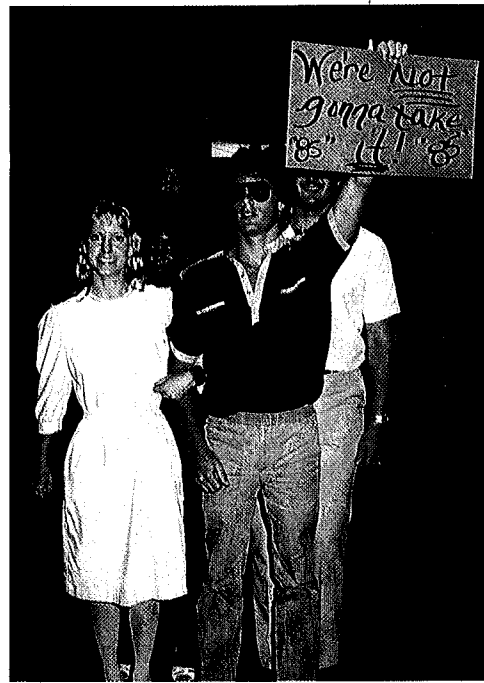

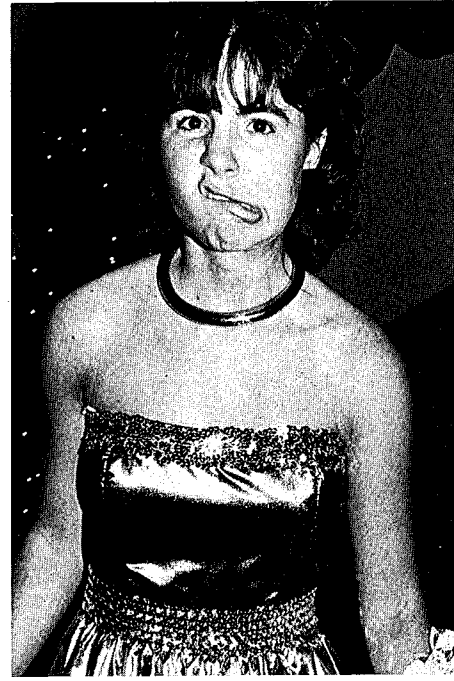
## Lake Wales Has Real Live Talent

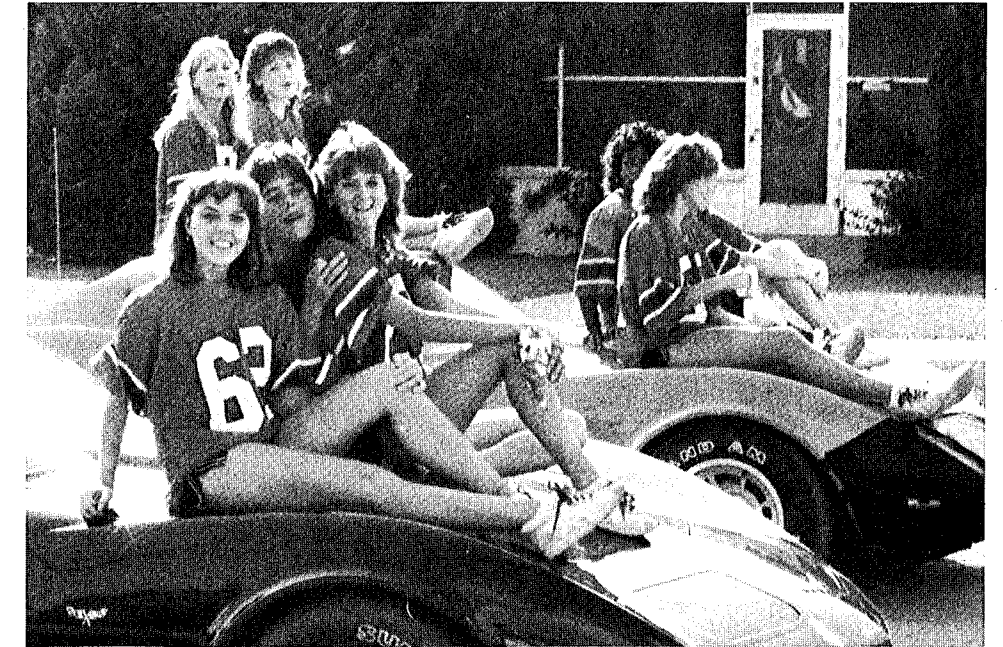

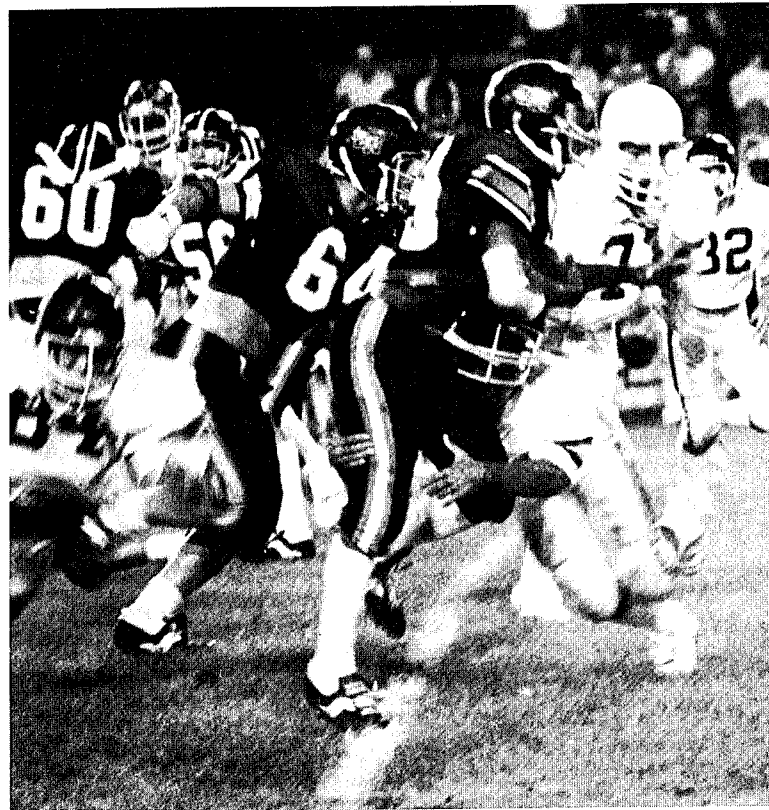


## The Offense . . .

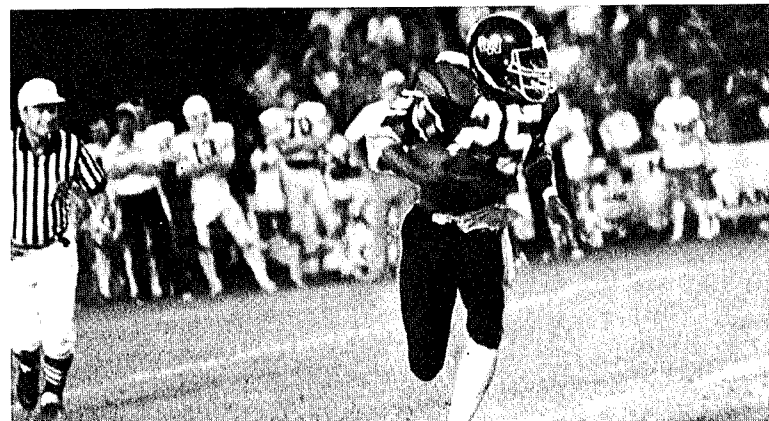
As the year began, ten returning starters led the offensive Highlanders. Losing the opening game to Kathleen, then winning the next three — these guys were ready for just about anything!

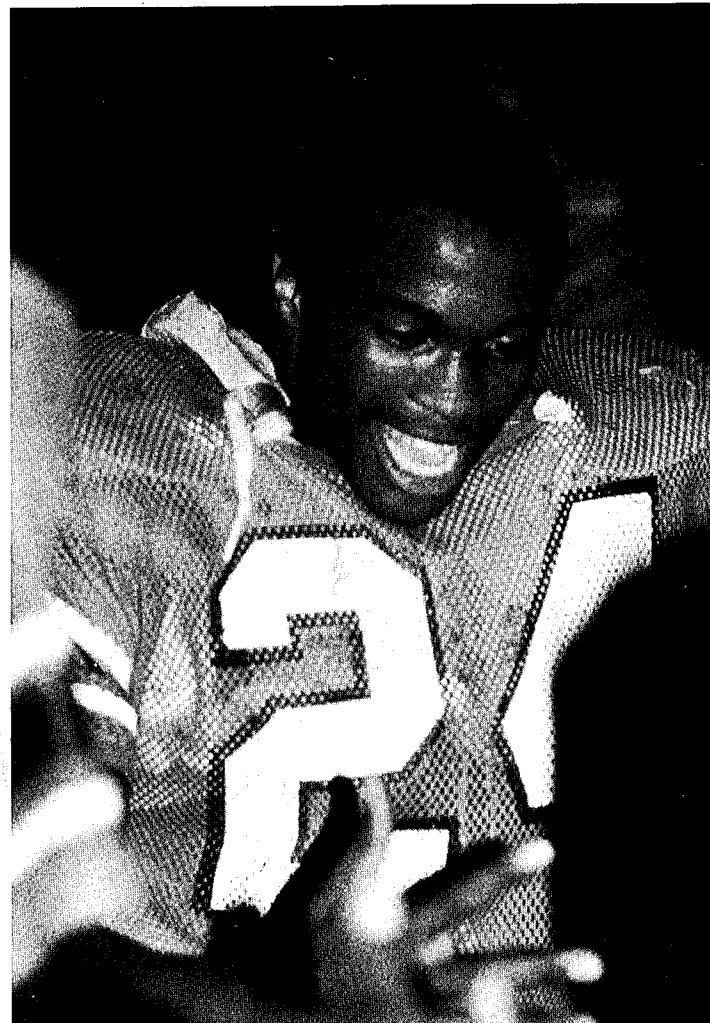

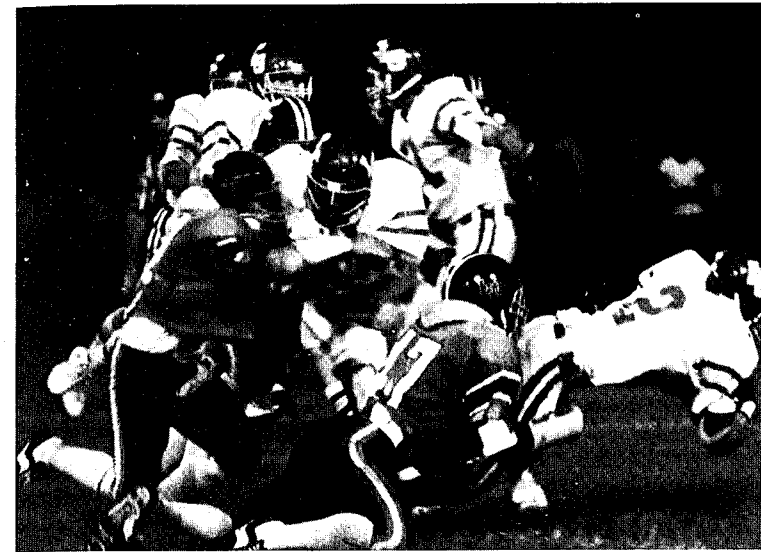

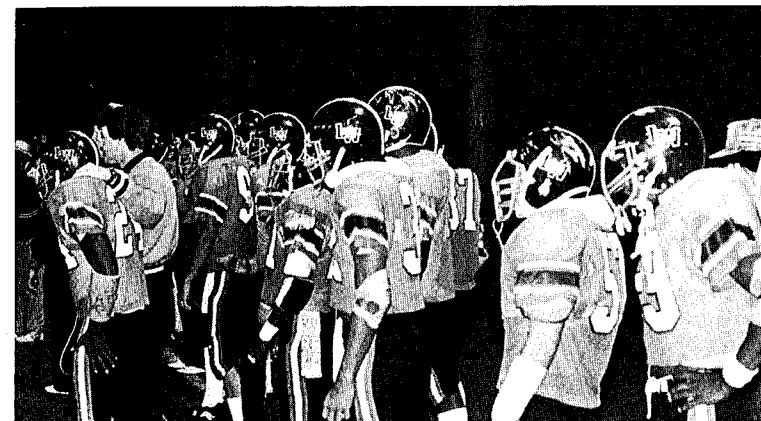

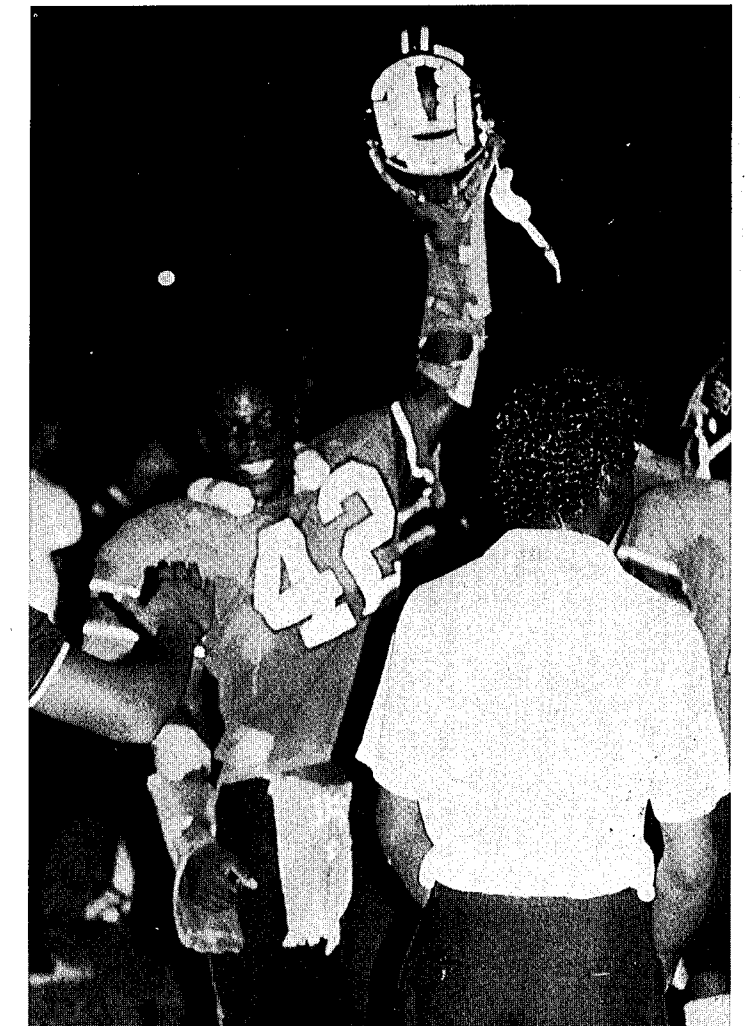

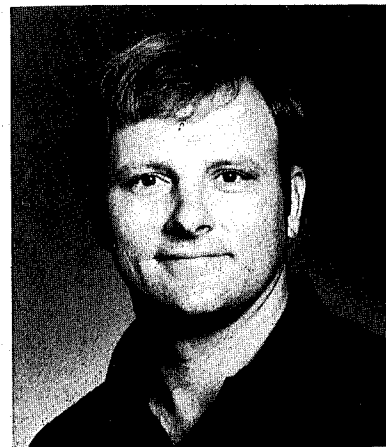


## LW Boasts Strongest Team

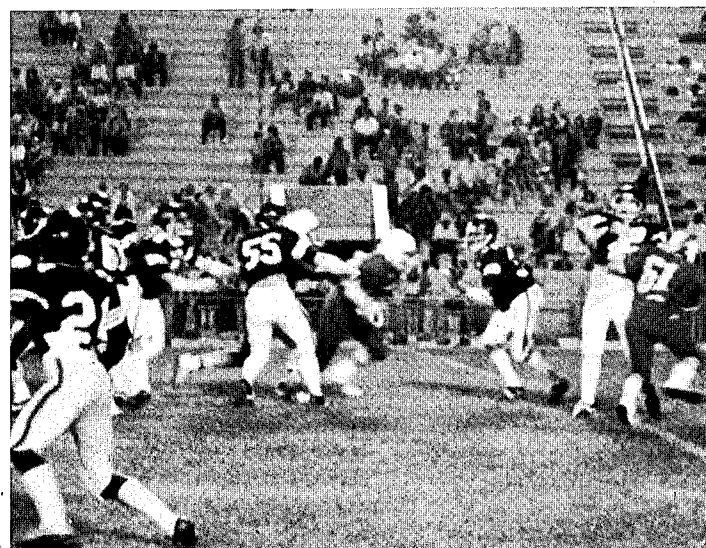


## Freshmen Show Great Promise

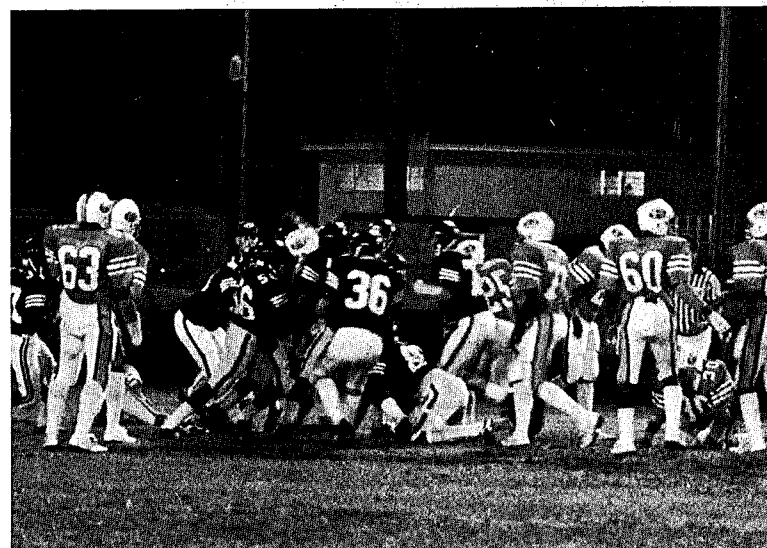

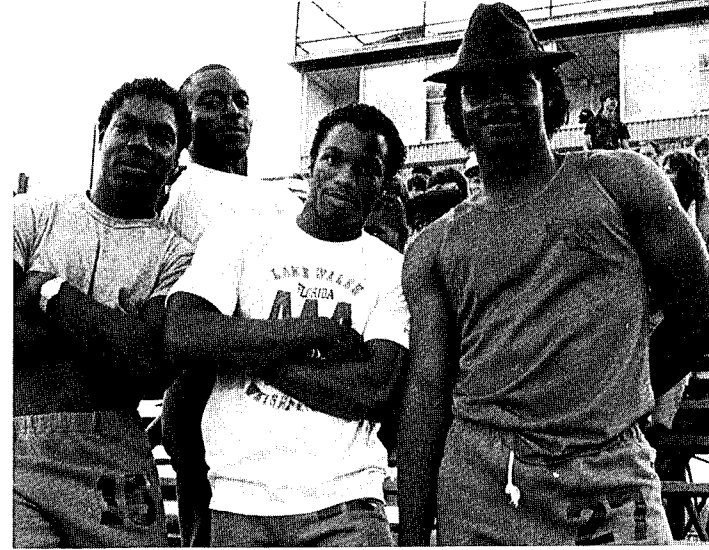


## On the Right Track!

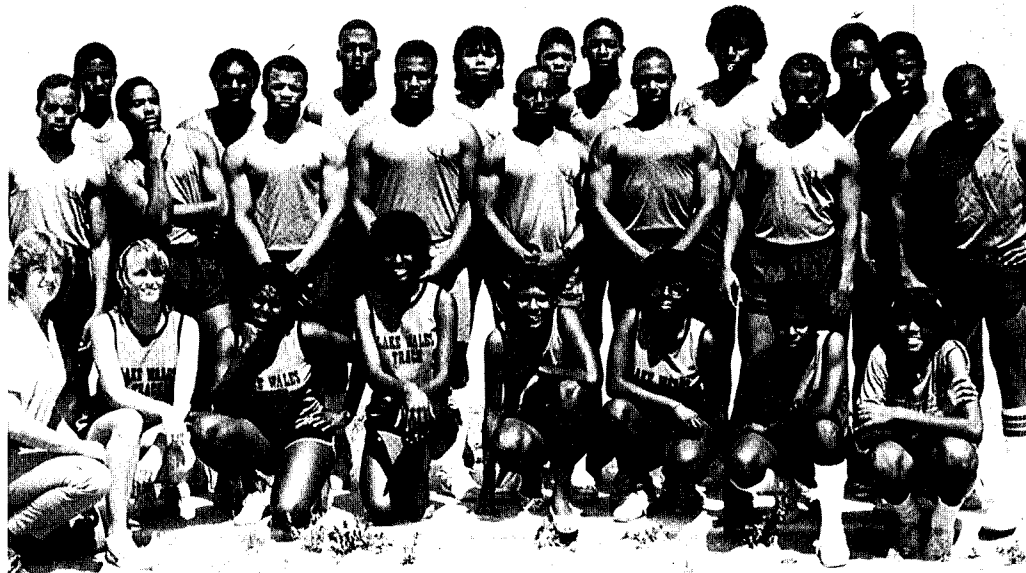
The track team sprinted their way to stardom as they overcame heat, cramps, exhaustion, and vigorous workouts to achieve their goal: to be the best in the county.

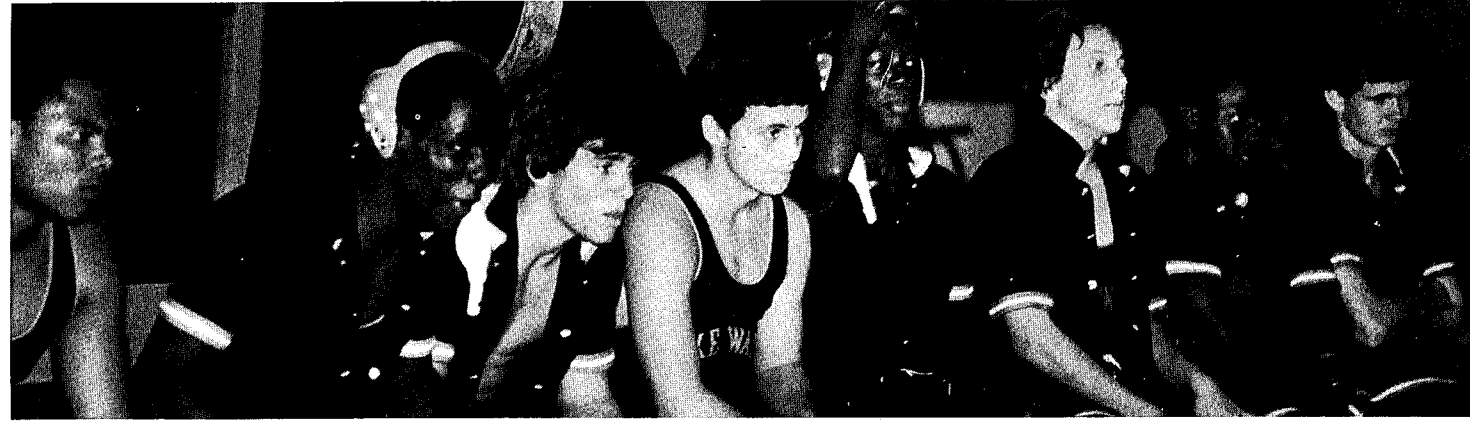
## Wrestlers Reach Regionals

Later in the year, Ford Motor Company presented a program to all sophomores on the importance of safety belts in cars.

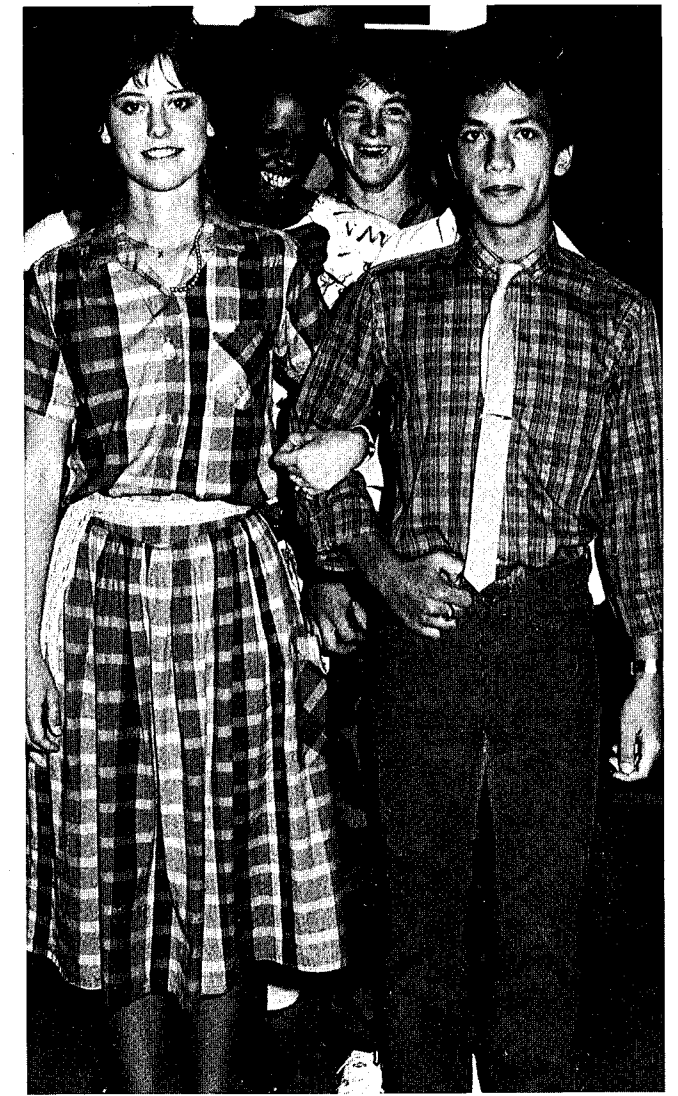

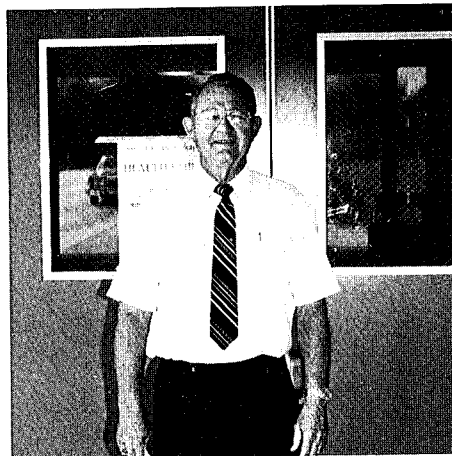


## RAISE Bill Takes Effect

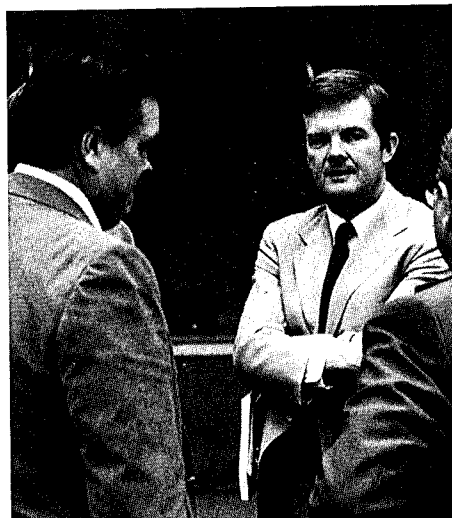

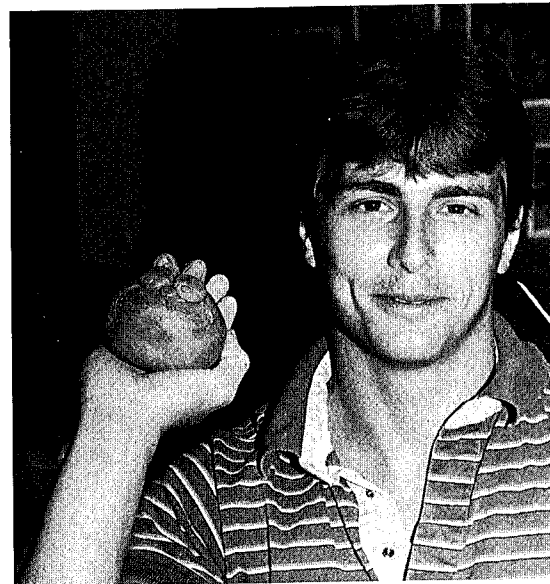


## Students Enter Art Contest

## Librarian Will Be Missed

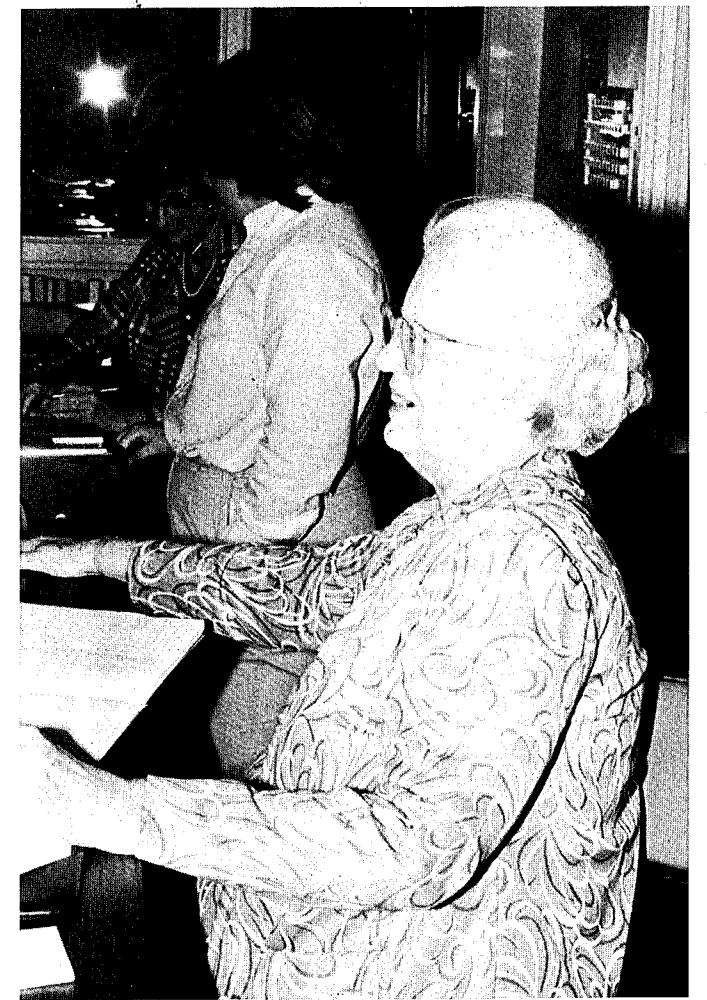

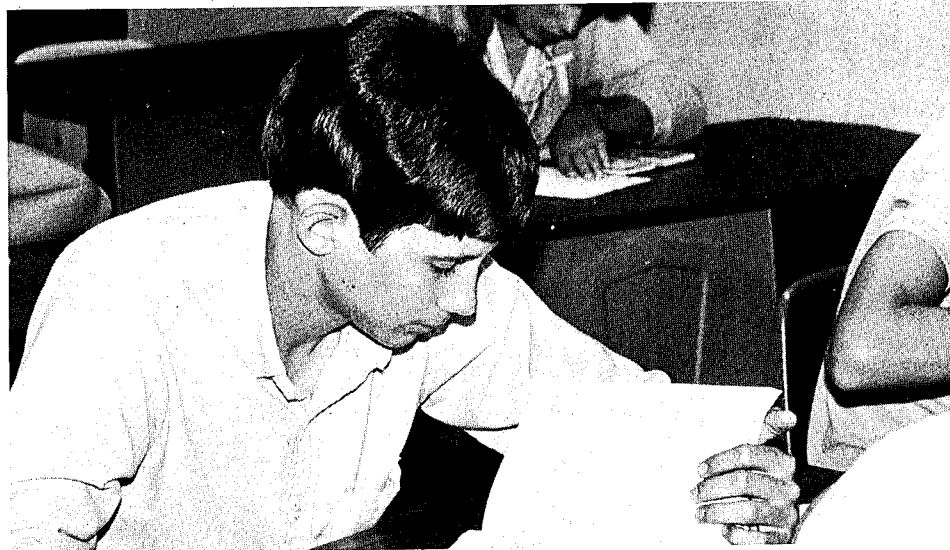
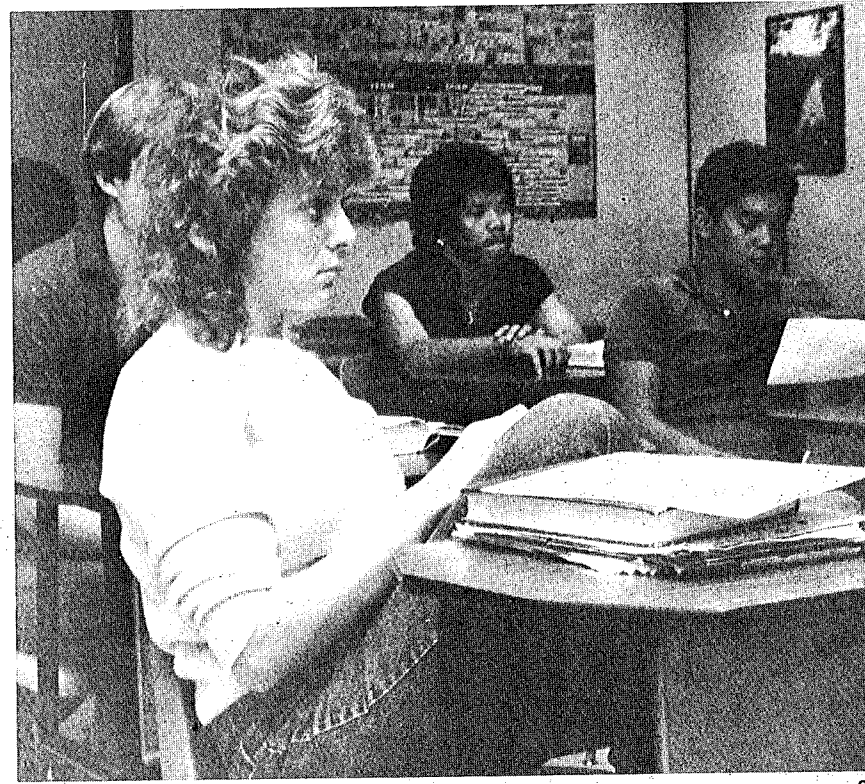


# Dealing in Numbers

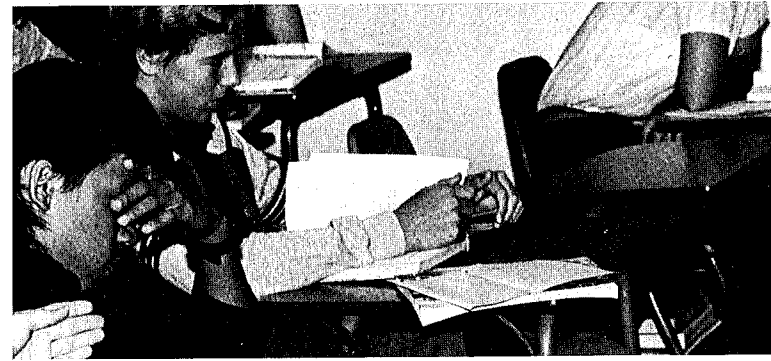
## Social Studies Makes History

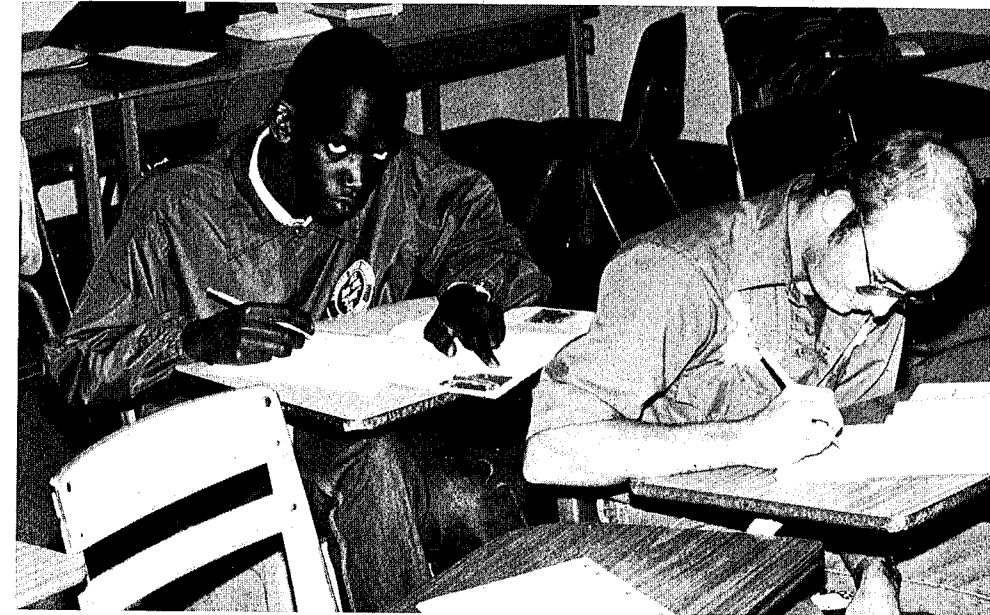

electives.

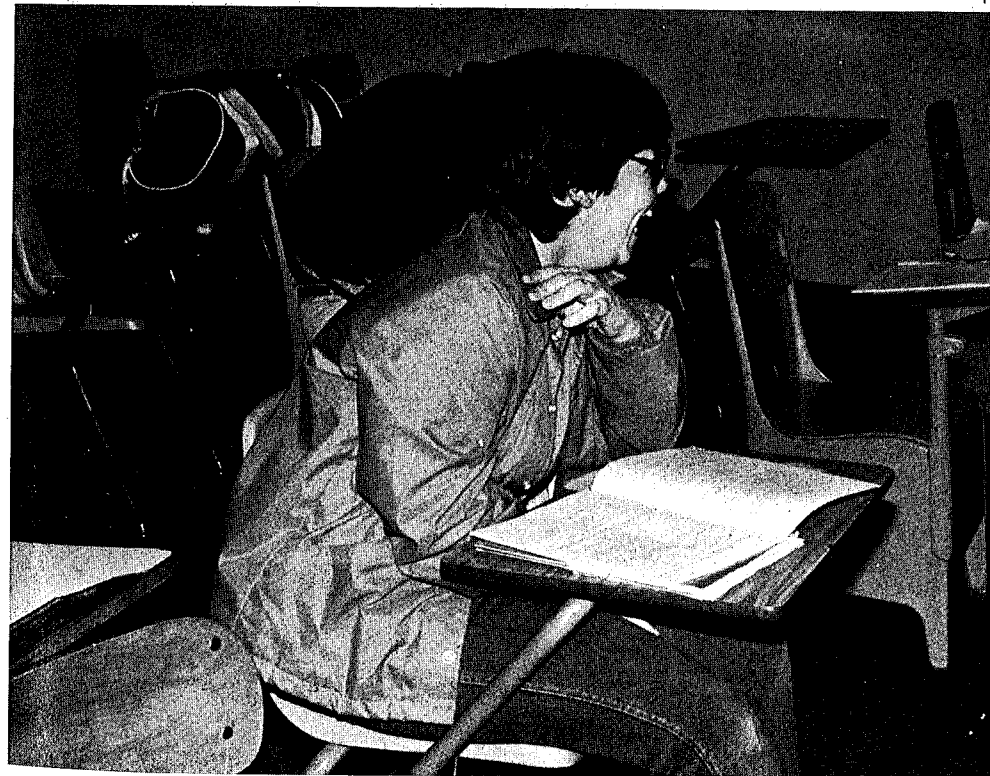

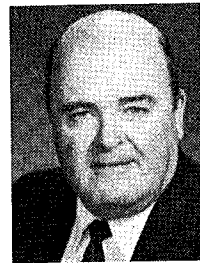
## Driver Education Cars Delay Grades

## Student Council Participates in Easter Seal Drive

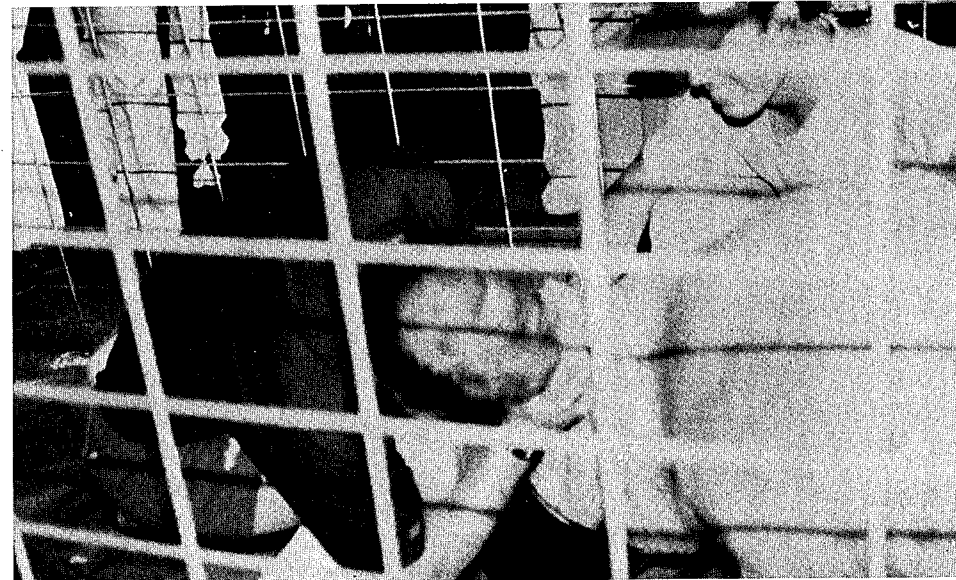

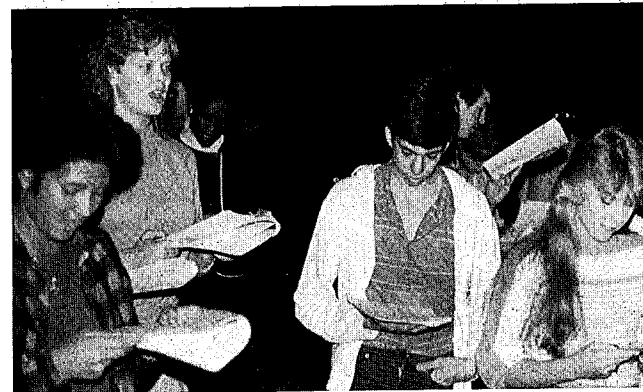


# Honor Society Sacrifices Hours

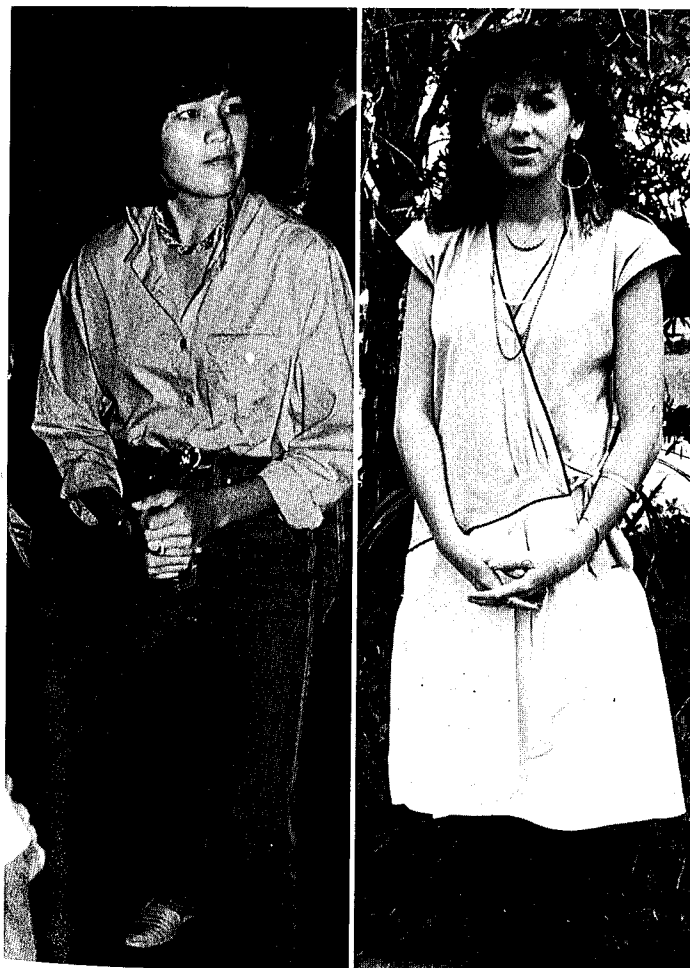
## Key Club Works Hard

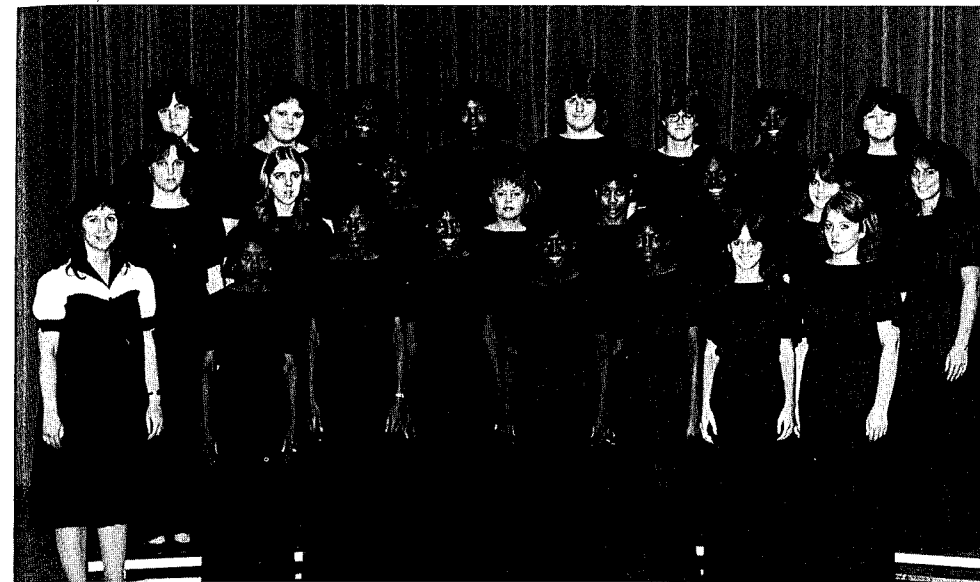
## Chorus Sings 'We Are the World'

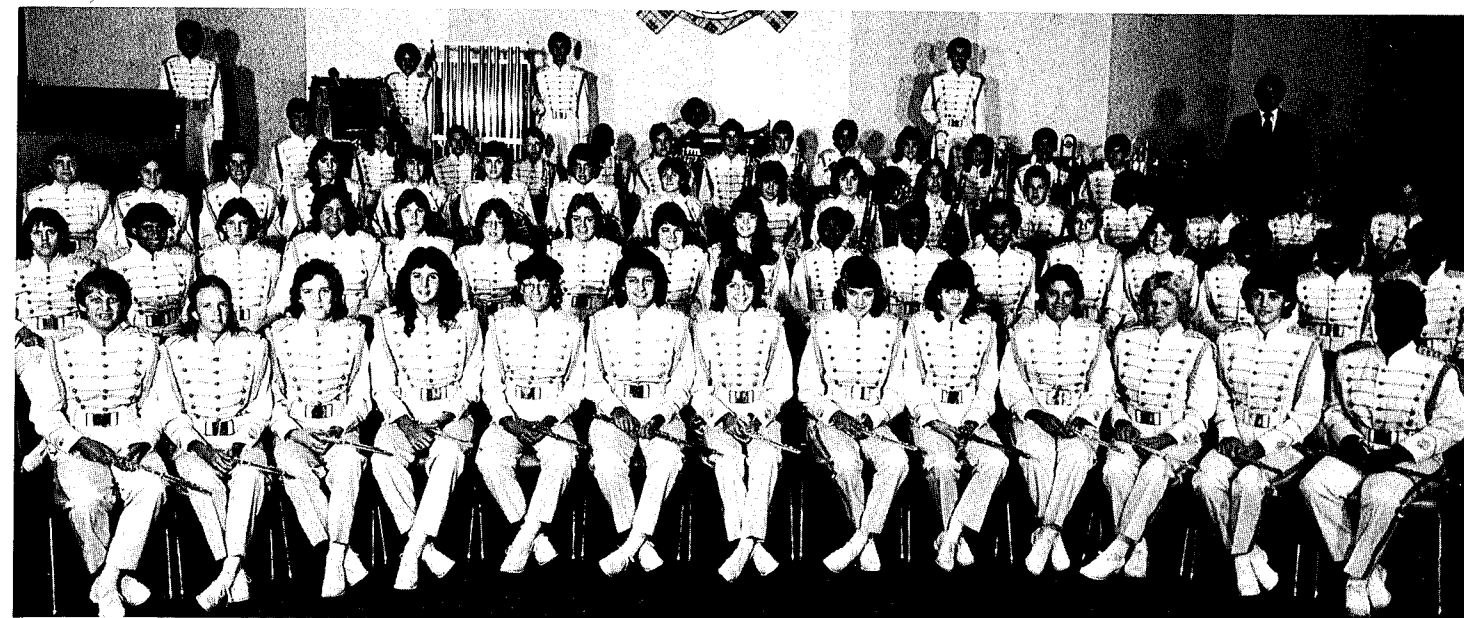
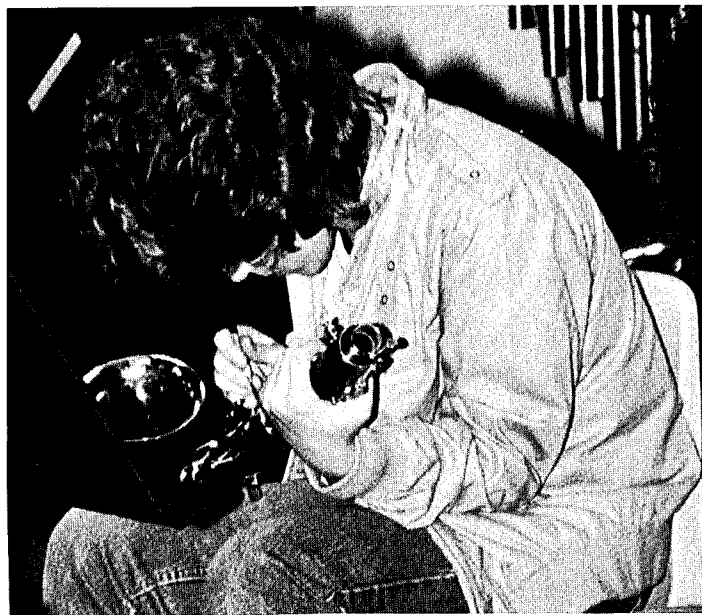


## Symphonic Band Participates in State Contest

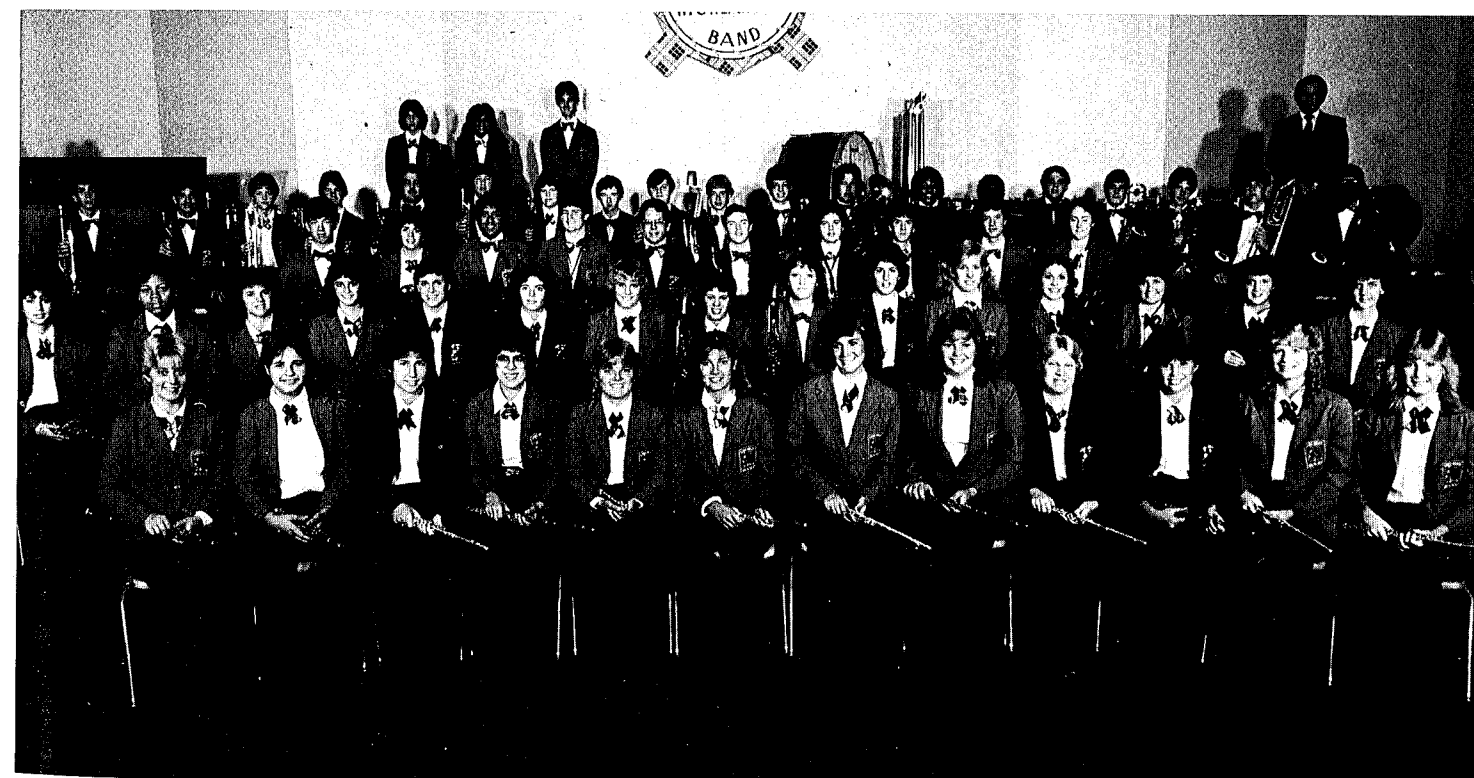

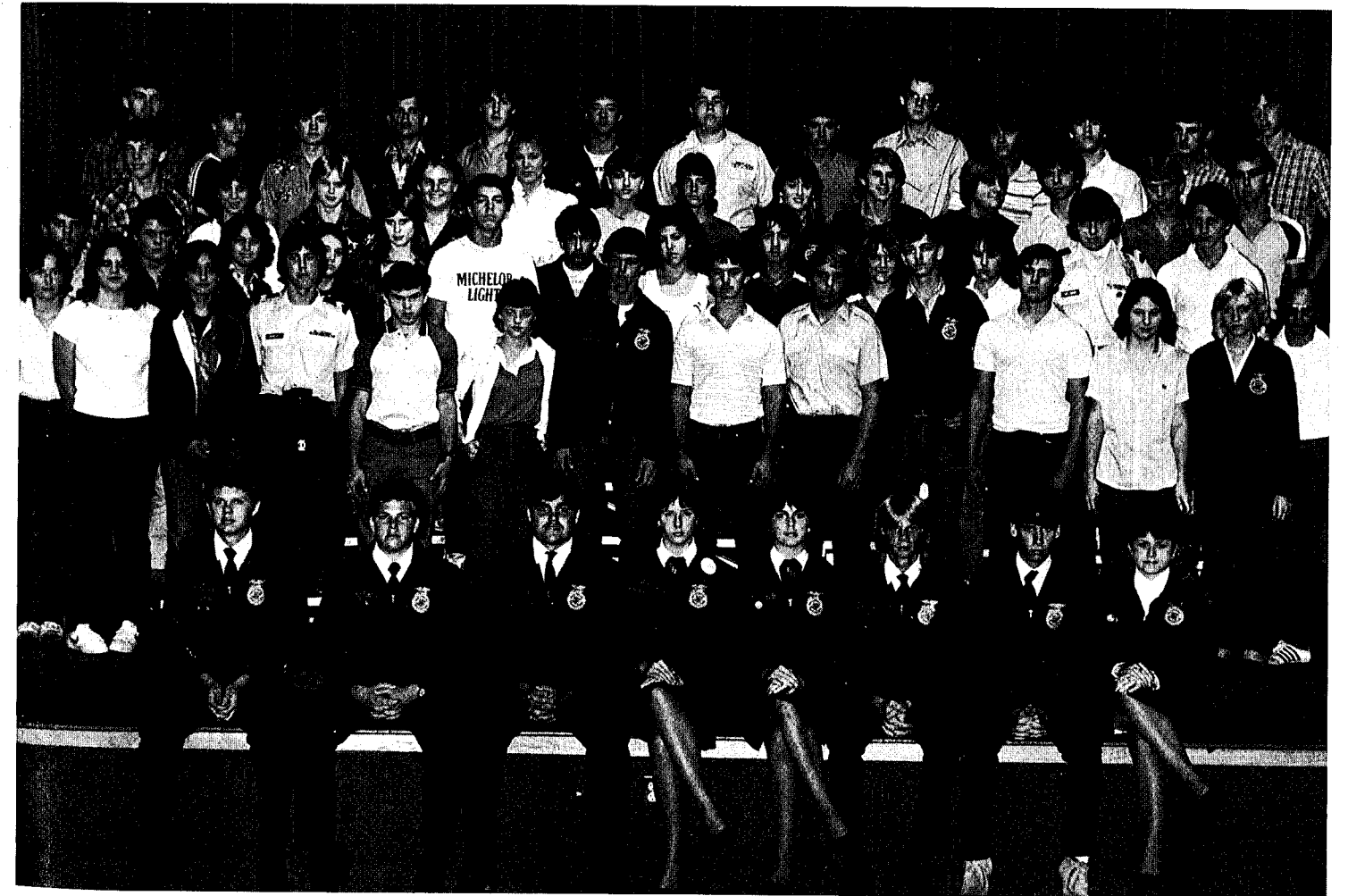
## FFA Wins Ribbons at Youth Fair

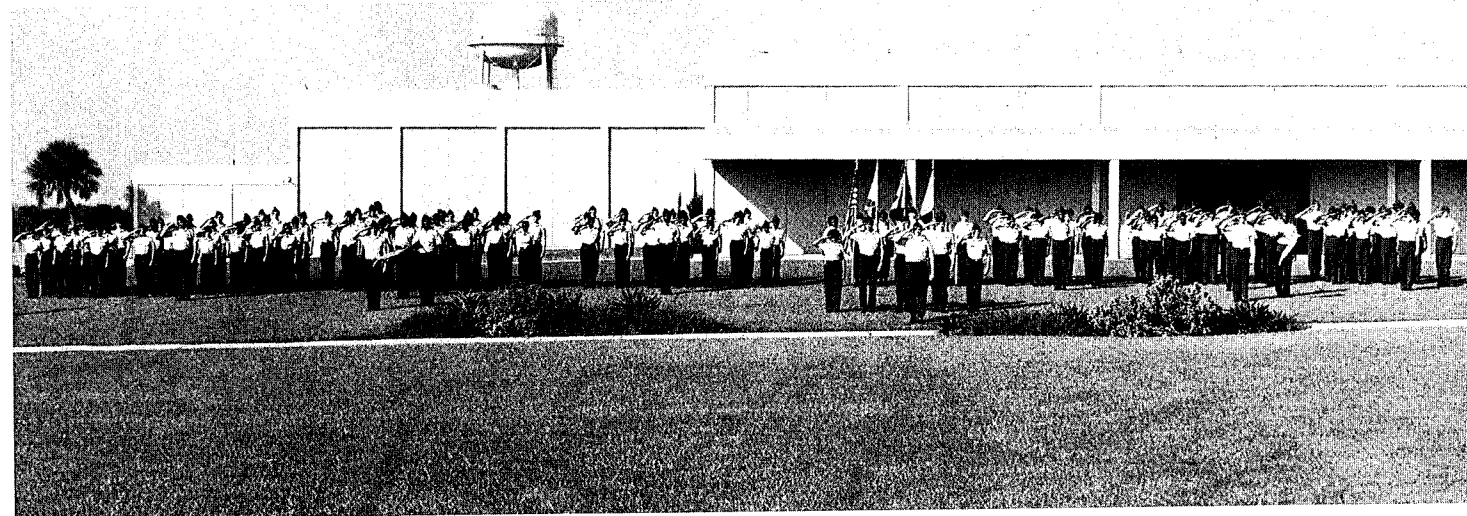
## State Meet Cancelled

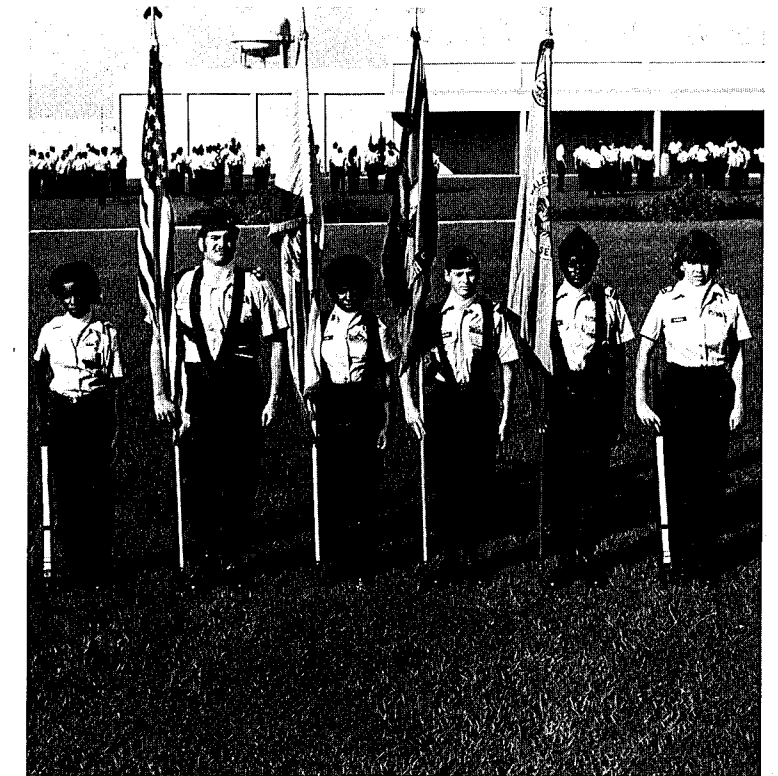

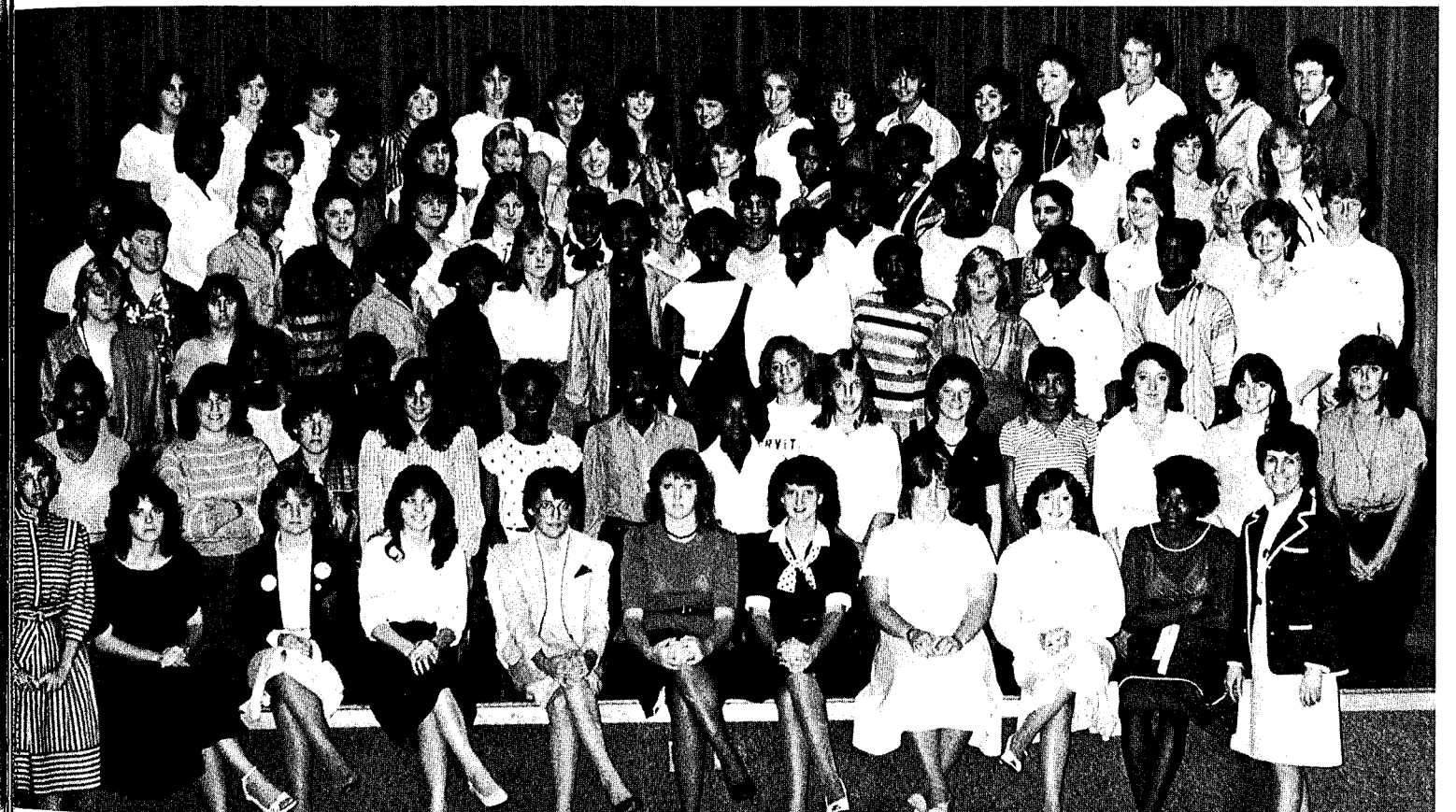

## Drama Club Acts Out Mystery Thriller 'Mouse Trap'

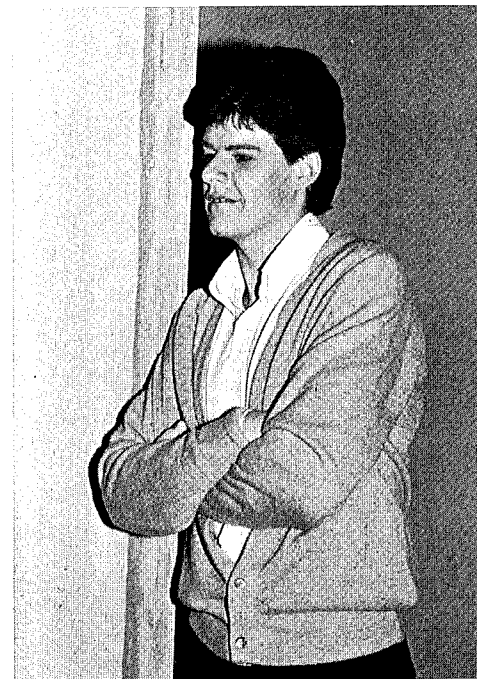

- 2 tbsp. cooking oil
  - 1 large onion, chopped
  - 1 clove garlic
  - 1/3 cup Worcestershire sauce
  - 10 oz. bottle Heinz 57 sauce
  - 2 tsp. lemon juice
  - 1 tsp. dry mustard
  - 1/2 cup honey
  - 1/4 cup white vinegar
  - 1/4 cup cooking sherry
  - 15 oz. tomato sauce
