DAILY Self-Certification Before Attending Koraes Elementary School

Please "Self-Certify" your child daily by asking the following questions. If any answer is "Yes", DO NOT send your child to school. This also includes any siblings.

DOES YOUR CHILD HAVE:

- A temperature of 100 degrees or more.
 - Do not send your child to school until the temperature is normal without Tylenol or Ibuprofen for 24 hours.
- Vomiting/diarrhea.
 - Do not send your child to school until they are symptom free for 24 hours.
- Strep throat diagnosis.
 - A child cannot return to school until 24 hours after prescription treatment and does not have a fever
- Infectious conjunctivitis (pink eye) diagnosis.
 - A child may return to school 24 hours after prescription treatment has begun.
- Ringworm
 - A child may return to school 24 hours after topical or oral anti-fungal treatment has begun.
- Impetigo
 - A child can return to school 24 hours after oral or topical prescription treatment has begun.

OTHER SYMPTOMS THAT SHOULD KEEP A CHILD HOME FROM SCHOOL

- 1. A rash that is undiagnosed
- 2. Irritated red, draining eyes
- 3. Persistent cough, chest congestion, or discolored nasal discharge
- 4. Shortness of breath
- 5. Sore throat
- 6. Headaches, fatigue, muscle or body aches

The health office tracks infectious disease occurrences in order to provide parents and school staff members with information about their prevalence and any needed precautions. The following are some examples of illnesses that should be reported:

- Strep Throat
- Fifth Disease
- Conjunctivitis (Pink Eye)
- Meningitis
- Ringworm
