What types of items are served? Cereals, muffins, donuts, Pop Tarts, Uncrustables and fruit cups. All items are whole grain or whole wheat. Cereals are 25% less sugar than regular cereals with 10 grams or less of sugar per serving. Fruit is packaged in lite syrup. All items are based on Food Program Requirements.

• USE SCRIP!

Both Maynards in Mt. Lake and Hy-Vee in Windom participate in the Scrip program. Use Scrip to purchase your groceries, and MLC earns a 5% donation from Maynards or a 10% donation from Hy-Vee. Over the past year, our collective purchases have made approximately \$8,000 for MLC using Scrip!
