- Ability to Accept Scholarships
- Part of Application Process

Opens October 1 for Next School Year (2023-2024)



Aid is First Come, First Served



Complete Each Year You Are Enrolled in College

FAFSA Myths



The FAFSA is only for low income students



I haven't applied to college yet, so I can't do my FAFSA



My parents are not US citizens, so I can't get financial aid



My parents have bad credit, so I won't be able to get a student loan



I support myself, so I won't need my parent(s)' information

- Create FSA IDs at FAFSA.GOV at least 3 days before you start your FAFSA
 - Student Parent

Requires Social Security Number (SSN)

- Federal income tax returns, W-2s, and other records of money earned
- Bank statements and records of investments
- Records of untaxed income





TIP: Use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool, if available.

This tool saves time and minimizes errors by pulling your most recent tax return information into the FAFSA application.

Look for it in STEP 5 (Parent Financials) of the FAFSA.





- Complete the FAFSA Application at FAFSA.GOV
 - Log in using student FSA ID
 - Create save key (share this with parent)
 - Best to work alongside your parent(s)
 - Complete application within 45 days information is cleared after this time





7 Sections

- Student Demographics
- School Selection
- Dependency Status
- Parent Demographics
- Parent Financials
- Student Financials
- Sign & Submit





- Follow Up with College Admission and Financial Aid Offices
 - Submit applications, transcripts, and other required paperwork
 - Ask about any special or updated family or financial situations





FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Which application year do I complete?
 - 2023 seniors complete the 2023-2024 FAFSA
- When will it be available?
 - Saturday, October 1, 2022
- When do I need to have it finished?
 - ASAP Aid is awarded first come first served to those who qualify





FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- What if I am not going to college or do not want to complete the FAFSA?
 - You may complete a non-participation waiver signed by a parent.
 The State of Alabama will issue the waiver for 2023 seniors some time after October 1, and counselors will make it available to you
 - Can I still complete the FAFSA if I turn in a waiver?
 - YES! The waiver does NOT affect your completion of a FAFSA at any time.
