Dear Parents/Guardians,

This year Dorchester District 4's Elementary Schools are implementing a new reading program entitled Core Knowledge Language Arts (CKLA). CKLA is a language arts program for Grades K-5 that combines an explicit, multisensory approach to phonics with rich texts that are carefully sequenced to build content knowledge so that learning to read and reading to learn develop together. Every day in Grades K-2, students complete one full lesson that builds foundational reading skills, as well as one full lesson that builds background knowledge. In Grades 3-5, students start to master the basic skills of reading, further opening up their worlds. Be on the look for Take Home informational letters and activities in your child's communication folders to complete at home.

The primary program goals of the TTAHC are to provide academic assistance and recreation for students after school. The 2022-2023 fee for the Homework Center is \$60 per child.
