Perhaps my prayer is a tall one, but the Lord can do this, if we are willing to seek Him out.

LITURGY MATTERS #9

After the Gloria is the opening prayer. In the past, this prayer was referred to as the "collect." The priest solemnly invites the people, "Let us pray."

Of course, we have been praying from the start, so this invitation means to signal a shift of levels, prayer with a different kind of attention. After a short pause for silence, the priest stretches his hands and says a prayer whose purpose is to "collect" into a few short lines, all the strands of what has taken place so far, as well as all the strands of our many individual thoughts. Therefore, this collect effectively places us all together into one succinctly expressed address to God the Father.

The prayer is addressed to Him and is always structured according to the same pattern, according to a very ancient usage. It helps to be attentive and listen for this pattern. God is first addressed, using one or more of His many titles. Next, we remember before God what God has done, not because He has forgotten, but because remembering is from biblical times a fundamental form of prayer.

Next, on the basis of what is remembered, we ask for something in the present, for ourselves and for the whole church and world. When we remember what God has done in the past, we have the courage and reason to hope for what we ask for in the present.

In the final move of this pattern of prayer, all that we ask the Father is asked "through your Son our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever."

In the pattern of the opening prayer, we have the shape or pattern of prayer that will mark all the praying of the Mass. All the prayers are addressed to God the Father, through the Son, in the Holy Spirit. This is the shape of our prayer, this is the pattern of our movement within the divine life of the Trinity. To this prayer all the people say, "Amen."


