Dear Parishioners I guests to our great city for the Bug Days celebration. I hope you are welcomed warmly.

Next weekend is our parish festival at St. Edward. Thank you in advance to all workers, from the planners to the clean-up crew and everyone in between. Also, thank you to those who have donated and to those who purchase those donated items or services.

In a discussion with some of my family, they were asking about the average festival. Their parishes are restructuring festivals, and they were wondering. I shared that the festivals are not really 'money makers' like they once were, but rather are about gathering, celebrating and becoming more of a family that works and plays together in addition to praying together. In that regard, they are wonderful and the reason I look forward to them. Of course, the meal is wonderful – and unlike last year, I can actually eat it this year. With all that in mind, come ready to serve and to celebrate.

In my continued genealogical research, I have come to the conclusion that I cannot be clearly related to Han Tausen. Elizabeth Tilley and her parents are also my ancestors. They were part of the Mayflower Passengers and while her parents died the winter of 1621, she survived, enjoyed the first Thanksgiving, and was married and had children and grandchildren. I also saw a line to the Bassette family in Quebec and was able to confirm that St. Andre Bassette is indeed my 4th cousin 5 times removed. All of these, by the way, are on my Dad's mother's side. I am trying to be skeptical, but it seems that her family is more interesting than I thought!

This endeavor is not just idol curiosity, but also a way for me to understand my roots better. I am who I am because of all these various people, and each is a part of my story whether I know it or not.

REFLECTION ~ Think about this ...

For today's action item, let us reflect on our demeanor as we enter the church for Mass. A person who walks into a meeting with someone he truly respects and admires would never drag himself through the door. Neither would he be looking around, trying to find an irrelevant reason to entertain himself. He knows why he is there. He knows who he is meeting.

Let us not be ungrateful to our Lord, the Creator of the universe, who desired to dwell in us in the Eucharist. Our demeanor should be that of humility, reverence, and focus. Let us ignore what others are wearing. If dress code is a recurring problem at our parish, it is often better to humbly ask the priest to address it. Above all, we must avoid being ungrateful to our good Lord for his immense kindness to us. We, too, like the Jews in today's passage, can miss out on greater graces if we cannot accept the smaller ones.

God is eager to help our unbelief.

Let us pray.

Lord, you came down from heaven to teach us and feed us with your most precious Body and Blood. Inflame our hearts with faith so that we may be fully formed in your divine image. We ask this in your most holy name. Amen.
