Welcome back! We're excited to kick off the new school year and hope you had a restful and enjoyable summer. This year, we are pleased to welcome two new administrators to our district: Mr. Tyler Jakse, Jr./Sr. High School Principal, and Mr. Dillion Eich, Elementary K-5 Principal. Please join us in giving them a warm welcome!

Both Mr. Jakse and Mr. Eich bring a deep commitment to serving our students, families, and staff. They are here to sup port student success, partner with parents, solve challenges collaboratively, and lead with professionalism, care, and com passion. We are confident they will be valuable additions to our school community and will help make this year a great one for everyone.

The first day for students will be Wednesday, August 13, 2025, and we will run a 2:05 P.M. early dismissal schedule that day. Back to school meetings for every grade level will be conducted August 11, 2025. A schedule of these meetings is included in this newsletter. The purpose of these meetings will be to explain rules, procedures, and expectations. In addition, students will meet their teachers, visit their classrooms, and drop off school supplies they have purchased. We will also distribute laptops to students in grades 6-12 during these meetings. Please make plans to attend our back-to-school night meetings.

Our District custodial staff members: Mr. Kyle Leech, Mr. Brandon Fowler, Mr. Jeremy Diehl, Mr. Caden VanDyke, and Mrs. Linda Hose are doing an excellent job in maintaining the school grounds and preparing both buildings for the new school year! Our school kitchen has been completely remodeled with new infrastructure, cooking equipment, serving equipment, flooring, and a new walk-in cooler. In addition the following work has been completed throughout the school: walls painted, repairs completed, floors waxed, and a thorough cleaning has been completed. Milledgeville School is in the best condition it has been in 60 plus years.

A student's success in school is influenced by their own effort and by the interest and cooperation of parents with the school. The primary reason students fail is because they do not complete their work. Help your child get off to a good start by monitoring their homework completion and checking their work on a regular basis. Back to School Grade Level Meetings

Back to School Grade Level Meetings will be held at Milledgeville School on Monday, August 11th. Laptop distribution for grades 6-12 will also take place during these meetings. Please refer to the schedule below for the time that corresponds to your student. Students and parents will receive a welcome presentation from district administration and then parents and students will report to their homeroom to meet their teacher and drop off school supplies. Breakfast Program for Grades K-12

Due to federal and state lunch program requirements, our district is required to provide breakfast each day for grades kindergarten through twelfth. The cost of the breakfast will be grades K-8 \$2.05/ meal and grades 9-12 \$2.30/meal. Children who qualify for free or reduced lunches will also be eligible for free or reduced breakfasts. The cost of a reduced price breakfast will be 30 cents. We will serve our first breakfast Wednesday, August 13, 2025.

Waiver of Student Fees

The School Board has established fees and charges to fund certain school activities. School fees may include, but are not limited to: required text-books and instructional materials; charges to participate in extracurricular activities; charges for supplies of particular classes; graduation fees; and driver's education fees.

The Board recognizes that some students will be unable to pay these fees; however, students shall not be denied educational services or academic credit due to the inability or unwillingness of parent(s) or guardians(s) to pay fees and charges.

Students whose parents are unable to afford student fees may receive a waiver of fees; however, these students are not exempt from charges for lost and damaged books, locks, materials, supplies, and equipment.

At the beginning of each school year, the school district's waiver of school fees policy will be published in the District newsletter. A fee waiver application form shall be available at the school office.

A student shall be eligible for a waiver of a fee when at least one of the following prerequisites is met:

- 1. The student is currently receiving aid under <u>Article IV of the Illinois Public Aid Code</u> (Aid to Families with Dependent Children).
- 2. The student is currently eligible for Free or Reduced Price Meals pursuant to <u>III. Rev. Stat.</u>, Ch. 122, Para. 712.1 et seq.

Additional consideration for fee waiver will be given where emergency situations exist. The parent or guardian shall submit evidence of eligibility for waiver of the student's fees. The Superintendent will notify the parent(s) or guardian(s) as to whether the fee waiver request has been granted or denied. A denied request shall state the reason.

Practice will begin on August 11th at the Milledgeville School from 8:00 to 9:30 AM. Please make sure you have your physical, insurance waiver, and fees paid. You must have all of these in order to practice. 7th graders and any 8th grader that hasn't played before will need to bring \$30 on the first day of practice in order to get a Streaks shirt that will be worn at games. Practice schedule for the first week:

Monday 8:00-9:30 AM, Tuesday 8:00-9:30 AM, Wednesday 2:10-3:45 PM, Thursday 5:30-7:00 PM, Friday 5:30-7:00 PM.

All practices at this time will be in Milledgeville.

Illinois Physical and Immunization Requirements

Physicals:

Complete physicals are required for students entering preschool, kindergarten, Grade 6, Grade 9, and students entering an Illinois school for the first time. Sports physicals are required for all school sponsored athletic activities.

**Check with your doctor to ensure all immunizations are up-to-date for your child's age.

Dental Examinations:

Dental examinations are now required for students entering Kindergarten, Grade 2, Grade 6, Grade 9, and students entering an Illinois school for the first time.

Vision Examinations:

Evidence of a vision examination is now required for students entering kindergarten and for students entering an Illinois school for the first time.

Schedule Doctor Appointments NOW!

Students who do not show proof of all required physical and immunization requirements by Friday, October 10, 2025, will be ineligible to attend school until the information is received by the school.
