Dear Parishioners.

Welcome to Lent. I pray that this season may be one of profound grace and growth for all of us. Please enter the season as a challenge to growth in the spiritual life.

I especially offer to you the great gift of the Sacrament of Penance. I offer the sacrament before the parish Masses (though Wednesdays are first for our students). I encourage you to come early in the season and early in the day you wish to go. If you and several others wait until 10 minutes before I am to begin Mass, you may not get to go.

Remember to mind your P's in the confessional. *Be prompt, be precise, be personal*. In confession, tell your sins as precisely as you can, and we don't need all the details or excuses. Fr. Schmidt shares the story that it is not enough to confess stealing a rope if there is a goat on the other end that you took as well. In confession, too, tell *your* sins – not what others did that made you angry or caused you to sin – it is your sin that needs to be confessed.

Next week, we are hosting one of three Eucharistic Preacher events. Fr. Joseph Laramie, SJ, will be with us at 2:00 pm on Sunday, February 25. He will preach, and we will follow that with a holy hour with adoration, confessions (three priests will be present), and prayer teams. We will end with a light reception hosted by the Eucharistic Revival Team. Please invite your family and friends.

Last week, I purchased a new Mac PowerBook laptop (hence the 5 Apple cards). #### FEBRUARY - CELEBRATE THE HOLY FAMILY

Why is February dedicated to the Holy Family? On February 2, the gospel reading take se the Holy Family to the temple for the Presentation of Jesus. The family is together. The Holy Family.

This February we should restore that devotion. It would both honor the Holy Family and at the same time become a reminder to strengthen family life. After all, the Church has taught how the Holy Family is an example for all families. So said St. John Paul II when he called "the family of Nazareth a model for every home."

What can we do as an individual family? As a domestic church, obviously, the Holy Family prayed together. We can imitate them by praying together as a family. Husbands and wives together. How about praying a Rosary during February, to start, in thanksgiving and honor of the Holy Family? Pray especially the Joyful Mysteries which includes the Holy Family from start to finish.

#### Other possibilities:

- Connect with the Holy Family. Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal one thing you have in common with the Holy Family, or with Jesus, Mary, or Joseph individually.
- Incorporate short prayers into your day, especially during difficulties: "Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, help me!" "Holy Family, help us be holy!"
- If your family is over-scheduled, create a time to bring everyone together with a meal or game night. Begin with a spontaneous prayer of gratitude for time together.
- Pray as a family. Take turns praying petitions for the needs of your family and household. Pray in gratitude for the blessings received. Do your best to attend Mass together.

#### ONE WORD PRAYER FOR LENT

In the clamor and frenzy of our daily lives, it's difficult to mark this season of confession, repentance, and humility as we'd like. But it's not impossible if we have a Lent plan. One way is to select one-word prayers for Lent. Use one each, starting on Ash Wednesday and ending just before Maundy Thursday.

Lent one-word prayers can be offered silently or whispered during daily activities. They can offer a prayerful respite in the most mundane moments. All it takes is a little intention, a momentary awareness, and sometimes a helpful trigger or reminder. Maybe before opening the mail. Or after hearing a car horn or barking dog.

Week 1 of Lent – one word prayer: Confess

In the first week of Lent, cultivate a heightened awareness of your own frailties and shortcomings by regularly praying "I confess..."




