The following is a list of supplies needed to help your child begin the new school year. All items on this list are required.

- (3) sharpened pencils (NEEDS TO BE PREPARED EVERYDAY OF THE SCHOOL YEAR).
- Erasable pens
- 3 erasers.
- 1 VINYL pencil case (NO PENCIL BOXES) labeled with your child's name.
- 5 marble notebooks.
- 4 plastic 2 pocket folders (1 green (HW), 1 yellow (Arabic), 1 blue (Islamic Studies), 1 red (Albanian)) NO DESIGNS ARE ALLOWED ON THE FRONT COVER.
- A small Webster dictionary.

Art supplies:

7. Tell what you liked or didn't like about the author's style on the BREAD bottom layer.
8. Last put your sandwich together with a staple.

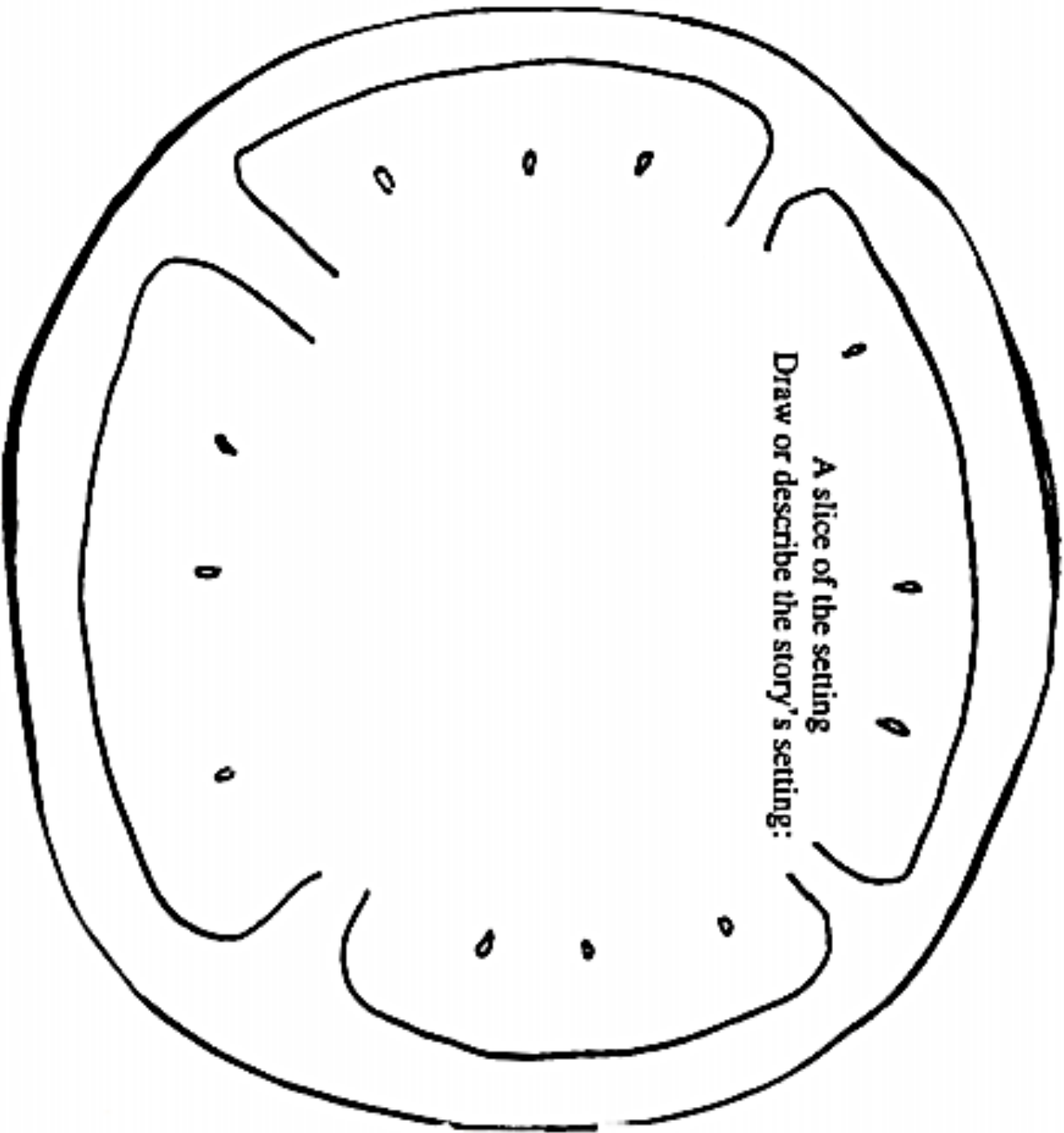


