CONTINOUS IMPROVEMENT PLAN (2025-2026

The district has made notable progress toward its continuous improvement goals this year. In the area of literacy, student achievement continues to trend upward with results that are five percent above our established target for the percentage of students demonstrating proficiency or moving up at least one tier in Istation. Secondary academic opportunities have expanded as well, with the number of dual credit courses offered and completed exceeding our annual goal. In addition, our secondary math and science scores have improved, resulting in a measurable closing of previous achievement gaps. Overall ISAT performance remains strong as most of our grade levels are meeting or exceeding state averages, affirming the positive trajectory of our instructional priorities and targeted interventions.
