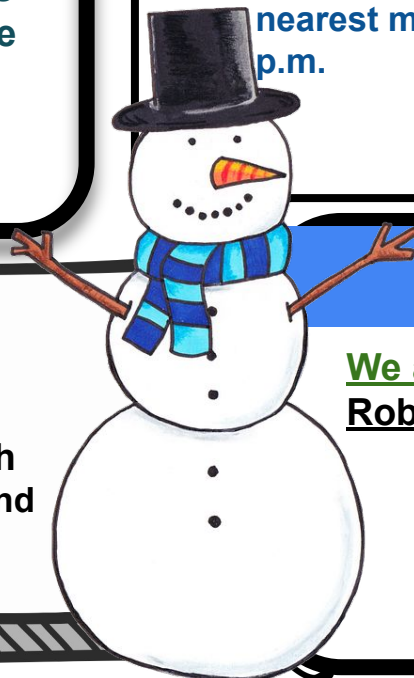
ELA

- Students will be able to retell stories from diverse cultures, determine their central message and write a fable that includes a cultural concept with a lesson or moral.

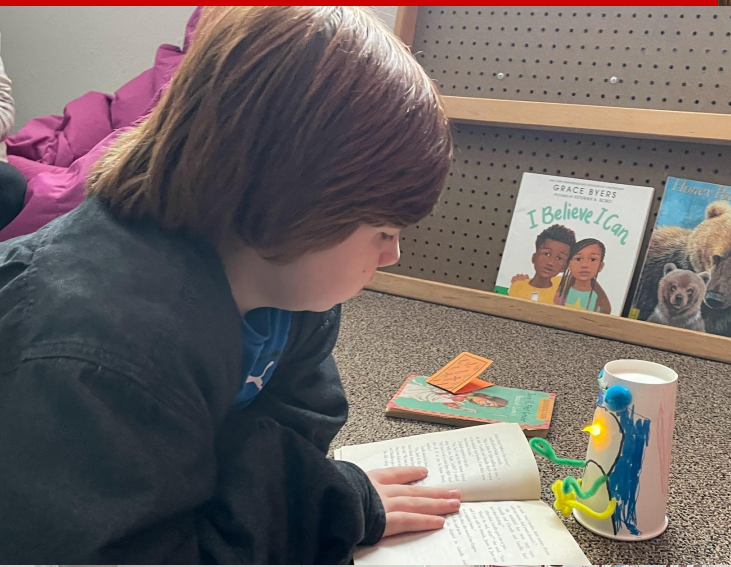
Math

- The Highly Proficient student can tell and write time to the nearest minute using a.m. and p.m.

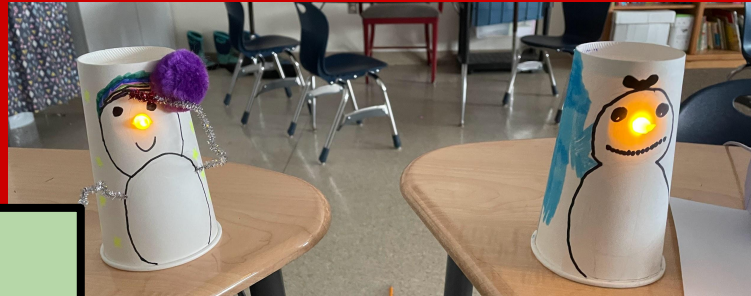

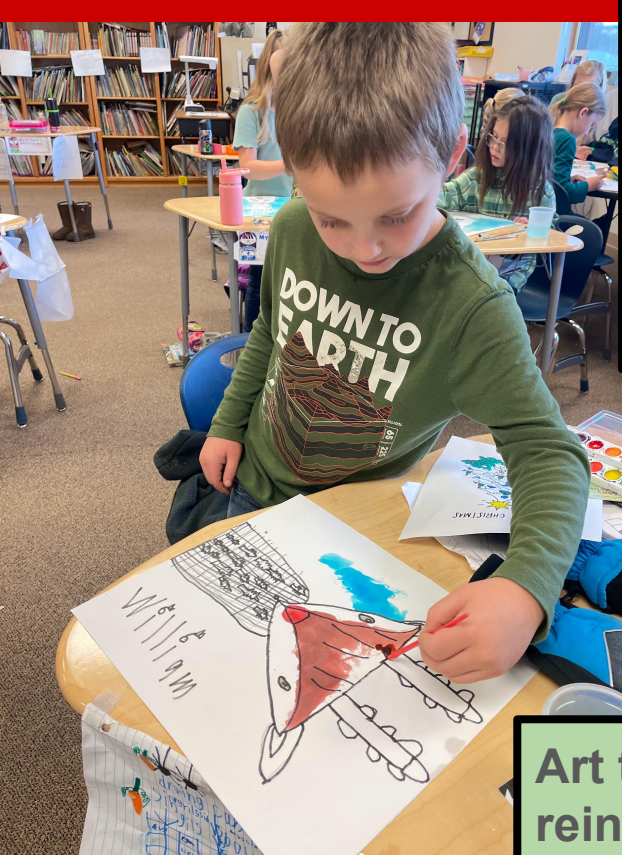
Cozy Winter Days in 2nd Grade
