## Helpful Hints

**Vowel teams:** When vowels stand next to each other, they are adjacent. When vowels are adjacent, the second vowel is silent, and the first vowel is long. (ue, example- clue)

-The pattern ew is vowel team that spells /oo/ or /yoo/. This spelling also usually comes at the end of a word, but it is sometimes followed by a consonant sound.

**Special Vowel Sound oo:** The double o has two sounds. It has the sound /oo/, as in zoo, and the sound /oo/, as in look.
