

Mason's Memo

Student Attendance Really Matters

Recently, I was reading an article about student attendance and I was reminded of a few common sense facts:

*There is a direct relationship between student attendance and student achievement.

*Teacher effectiveness is a strong factor of student success.

*Chronic student absence reduces even the best teacher's ability to provide learning opportunities.

*Students who attend school regularly have been shown to achieve at higher levels than students who do not have regular attendance.

*Absenteeism in kindergarten was associated with negative first grade outcomes such as greater absenteeism in subsequent years and lower achievement in reading, math, and general knowledge.

So, to put it in a nutshell, a student can have the best teacher in the country but if they don't come to school their achievement and future could be negatively affected.
