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Good afternoon parents and students, I wanted to thank all the teachers who have recently been giving us input on our seniors who are currently on track to be an A-G completer. As you may recall, A-G requirements are a series of courses that students take throughout their four years of high school in order to be eligible to apply for a four year college. At the beginning of this school year we had approximately 290 seniors on pace to be an "A-G completer" in June. At the first grade check we had about 60 of those students in jeopardy of falling off pace. Since then we have been doing a lot of student interviews and making a lot of parent phone calls to learn exactly what is causing these successful student to struggle. We have learned a lot from these interviews about designing better interventions for these seniors. If we can retain most of these "on track" seniors we will set an all-time high in A-G completion rates, but more importantly, we will have succeeded in assisting more students in becoming UC/CSU eligible.
