• Superintendent's Report – Dr. Scott Hagerman

Summer Planning –

Title I funding is decreasing. The number of summer school classes may be impacted at the elementary site level. At the junior high level, students who need remediation will have programs available. At the high school, students focused on credit recovery will also have programs available.

Ms. Fry asked approximately how many elementary students typically sign up for summer school, Ms. Rosalik said they normally have about 60 students who are enrolled in reading or math classes.

Enrollment Update -

Dr. Hagerman provided current enrollment data and projected enrollment (2018-19 SY) for Board Members to review. There was discussion regarding the 9th grade and kindergarten, these grade levels are the most challenging to project. However, the trend data reveals more 8th grade students are opting to attend Tanque Verde High School.

Menu of Assessments –

There are a variety of assessment tools that can be used to assess student growth and knowledge: AzMerit, SAT, PSAT, ACT. Dr. Hagerman said he will be looking at the assessment process and seeking guidance from site councils, students and teachers. Student Board Member Kaitlyn McWilliams shared with Board Members that high school students take several tests in preparation for college entrance requirements. The AzMerit test carries the least priority in terms of importance for her.

Dr. Hagerman said he will gather information and bring it back as a Board update.

• Budget update and Planning – Mr. Adam Hamm

Mr. Hamm presented a PowerPoint of the District Timeline and Planning for 108-19 Budget.

 - this could give an estimated increase of \$238,000
- An additional \$34M to existing 1.06% teacher salary increase making a total increase of 2%

6. INFORMATION AND DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. Feasibility Update – Dr. Hagerman

Dr. Hagerman updated Board members about the first Superintendent's Feasibility meeting that was held earlier this week. The meeting was well attended by committee members, consisting of students, staff and parents. The committee understands the purpose of the committee work is to assess the district's needs in relation to the educational program and school facilities, and to provide guidance related to the 2018 election. Ms. Anne Velosa and Ms. Susan Fry have agreed to Co-Chair the committee.

Mr. Ruiz mentioned the survey information that was gathered from the previous override, and how valuable the information was. Dr. Hagerman acknowledged we will be working with the same survey group, *Higher Ground*, to conduct the survey of registered voters. Survey questions are currently under development.

The committee meets next on Tuesday, March 20 from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

7. ACTION ITEMS

A. Assistant to the Principal position at Agua Caliente Elementary School– Dr. Scott Hagerman

Dr. Hagerman recommended Ms. Chris Reitz as the Assistant to the Principal at Agua Caliente Elementary school.

MOTION: Mr. Neff made a motion to approve Chris Reitz as the new Assistant to the Principal position at Agua Caliente Elementary School. Mr. Auslander seconded; the motion carried unanimously.

B. CTE / Fine Arts - Dr. Scott Hagerman

After a thorough vetting by the high school site council, students will have options from which to choose to satisfy CTE / Fine Arts requirements. The credit requirements may be satisfied with 2 Fine Arts credits, 2 CTE credits, or one of each.

MOTION: Mr. Neff made a motion to approve the CTE / Fine Arts requirements as proposed. Ms. Auslander seconded; the motion carried unanimously.

C. PE Requirements – Dr. Scott Hagerman

PE credit requirements may be satisfied through a variety of other options such as Marching Band and Sports teams. Site administrators and staff will work directly with students to identify other paths to satisfy PE requirements.

MOTION: Mr. Ruiz made a motion to approve the PE requirements as proposed. Mr. Auslander seconded; the motion carried unanimously.
