From Nurse A's Office:

All entering 12th grade students are required to have

a Meningococcal vaccine (MCV4, meningococcal conjugate) after the age of 16 years per the Pennsyl-



vania Department of Health and Education. If your child has already received the required vaccine, please send this information to the school nurse. Your health care provider may fax this information to the school nurse at 717-530-2835. If you do not have health insurance, the vaccines can be obtained from the Pa. State Health Department at 717-243-5151.

All 11th/12th grade students are required to have a physical examination per the Pa. Departments of Health. This is a graduation requirement. There are several ways to fulfill the obligation.

- · Copy of a paper driver's permit or driver's license card (accepted because a physical was required before the permit test)
- · Copy of a Sports physical
- · Copy from your private physician's office

If your student has not already had these appointments, please schedule as soon as possible and send the date of the upcoming appointment to the school nurse.

The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) will be administered on Wednesday, October 30th starting at 7:30am and concluding by 10:30am at SASHS. This test is administered FREE to interested 10th, 11th and 12th grade students. The ASVAB is an excellent career exploration tool. The test helps identify the student's interests and aptitude in the following areas: verbal, math, sciolentify the student's interests and aptitude in the following areas:

When the students' scores are interpreted, he/she will learn how their interests and skills relate to the demands of more than 400 occupations, helping them to identify suitable career options. It is also used by all branches of the military for persons interested in joining the military. Taking the test does NOT in any way obligate a student to the military. Completion of these activities is required before the end of junior year. By the end of 11th grade, all students must have completed activi-

Last May, 729 students, 95 staff members, and 50 families completed the Youth Truth Survey. The survey provides input from our stakeholders to our administration and teachers on the following topics: engagement, relationships, and culture. Here are some highlights from the data we received:

We learned that... 83% of staff agreed with the statement, "Students are getting a high-quality education at our school."

We were surprised that... 16% of students agreed with the statement, "Students from my school treat adults with respect."

Here is a question that we have..."How are students defining respect?""

We are proud that...62% of families and 74% of staff members agreed with the statement, "Staff and students care about each other."

We plan to follow up on hearing from you by....meeting with our engagement and well-being committees. We are reviewing our PBIS lessons to ensure Respect is covered in our CHAMP lessons. Some things our committee are working on is - how to get students more engaged in the scheduling process, increase course offerings to include high-interest electives, review the grading scale and grading practices, explore a transition course for our 9<sup>th</sup> graders.

### Career Corner

Students in AP Computer Science had the opportunity to get an exclusive behind-the-scenes look at the advanced drone technology used in the Pixis light show at Volvo on September 16th. They were introduced to the drones responsible for creating the aerial displays and explored the cutting-edge software that controls the choreography of the drones, highlighting how computer science powers real-world applications in entertainment and industry. This hands-on learning experience gave students valuable insights into the intersection of robotics, programming, and innovation.
