Twelve WIN Academy students graduated from the new ReCLAIM program provided by the Project Aware and Student Services teams on May 15th. Four middle school students and eight high school students participated in the nine week program. ReCLAIM was developed to assist students in the expansion of self awareness, while recognizing the consequences of their actions. The program focuses on supporting students to identify challenging behaviors and link those behaviors to emotions, actions, and consequences. Students participated in skills based learning centered around prosocial behavior integration. They evaluated the role of self in the planned change process to include the responsibility to self, others, and the community. The program was a huge success, and we congratulate the 12 students on their accomplishment!



Happenings at LSSC



In partnership with Women of Equality, the Lindsey Student Support Center was honored to host a Community Baby Shower for expectant mothers in Houston County. The mothers-to-be were greeted by event organizers and presented with gift bags containing new baby supplies including diapers, wipes, formula samples, and clothing. Desserts and beverages were also served to the mothers and their guests. As part of the event, local organizations set up display tables with free child-care items, resources, and information. Whether it was their first or last baby, the mothers were pampered, supported, and most importantly, felt the love of their community.

The Lindsey Student Support Center had the honor of hosting twenty-two film students from Houston College and Career Academy. They used several spaces in the LSSC as locations and settings for their final film project. HCCA students directed, produced, and performed at the LSSC. The interactive workshop focused on building positive relationships, understanding stress and conflict, putting language to emotions, preventative skills building, and making positive outcomes from difficult circumstances. The Project Aware Team works closely with the LSCI Team and will continue to offer workshops similar to this one in the future. Workshop participants received textbooks and lessons to take with them.
