Dear Parishioners,

Happy Labor Day weekend, and sadly the unofficial end of summer. I hope that this weekend affords us rest from our labors, as we set the day aside to reflect on how our labor is a cooperation with the labor of God as He creates and maintains the world. Yes, each of us has a role in that labor.

I admit that I am convinced that each of us has a task, and that it is our duty to labor. I am pleased to see a physically disabled person as a greeter, for example, or for those with intellectual disabilities working in little tasks. Work is not a four-letter word! In fact, it is necessary for us.

I continue to grow and trim the family tree. I have come to learn, however, that certain things about Ancestry.com are frustrating. If someone pieced together pieces of scattered data, say a woman born in 1760 in France, baptized in England the next day with a different name, giving birth to in 1720. Read that again! I found a few of those errors, so the tree got trimmed!

Due to such errors, I was able to show that there is no clear connection to Zwingli, the Swiss reformer. However, I am clearly related to Tausen, General Lee, and Washington, both in double ways, and surprisingly, Anne Boleyn. I almost lost my head! Her uncle, my 14th Great-Grandfather, Griffith-Fitzuryon Rhys, married Catherine Howard, her mother's sister. Apparently, my father's mother's maternal grandmother was a descendant of the Balls (G. Washington), Lees, and Rhys families. This is something I find surprising, to be honest, but then I did not know my father's family must beyond my limited encounters with his immediate family.

Regarding my continued research, I am going through more systematically the lines, and if there is doubt, I am trimming. I would rather be certain than complete. Even so, I am finding lots of lines going back. I find myself praying for these ancestors and amazed in seeing the little facts of their immigration, their occupations, weddings and baptisms.

All these things a part of their story, and a part of mine. But it also leads me to challenge you to know your story and to assure that your children and grandchildren will share it with their children and grandchildren. My mom's parents did that with me, and so the names of my great grandparents are so easy to recall.
