School Responsibilities

Holloway Elementary School will:

1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:

Holloway Elementary School offers a high-quality curriculum by high qualified faculty and staff. We do this with a well-equipped, supportive faculty that provides an effective learning environment with minimal disruptions and distractions. All teachers are trained through staff development that enables them to instruct students at various levels and in a variety of ways to meet academic challenges.

2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held:

All initial parent-teacher conferences will be held before December 17, 2024. All these conferences will discuss Spring 2024 test results and first quarter Diagnostics and ACAP results with parents.

3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows: Each quarter parents will receive progress reports during the middle of each quarter to keep them informed of student progress. Teachers send home weekly or even daily reports to parents. Parents may also check their child's grades on PowerSchool at any time to see their child's progress.

4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows: Our staff will be available for conferencing during teacher planning times each day. Teacher sometimes hold conferences before or after school to accommodate parents' work schedules.

5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows: Parents are encouraged to volunteer their time around the school. Parents are welcome to set up appointments to discuss classroom activities. We welcome their efforts through Parent Advisory Council, and CIP Committee.

6. Ensure regular two-way, meaningful communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand. The school will communicate to parents via email, school messenger, school bulletins, classroom newsletters, school marquee, social media, and Class Dojo.

Parent Responsibilities

We, as parents, will support our children's learning in the following ways:

- Monitoring attendance by getting my child to school on time daily.
- Making sure that homework is completed.
- Participating, as appropriate, in decisions relating to my children's education.
- Promoting positive use of my child's extracurricular time.
- Staying informed about my child's education and communicating with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district.
- Serving, to the extent possible, on advisory groups, such as Title I advisory committees and parent and family engagement committees.
- Do my homework every day and ask for help when I need to.
- Read at least 30 minutes every day outside of school time with my child.
- Give to my parents or the adult who is responsible for my welfare all notices and information received by me from my school every day.]
