 - i. We started this in 2020 so we need to update the data for all 3 years- this year concludes our current 3 year plan
 - ii. Goal Analysis- Reviewed how our goals were carried out in the past year
 - 1. We will be offering summer school STEAM enrichment classes this year.
 - a. We are almost full
 - 2. PD days continue and expand to our classified staff this year
 - 3. New Apprenticeships this year
 - a. California State's first Tech Apprentice graduated through the Ripon Unified School District's ARCH program this year
 - b. Added an Ag apprenticeship this year for current high school students
 - 4. Enrollment for the Dual Immersion Program continues to grow, so we are always looking for BCLAD teachers
 - 5. This year our ELA took a little bit of a dip, but our Math scores have made growth. We have been actively working on extra professional development in the math department.

- 6. Student Study teams were held in order to help target students who may be struggling and how to best support them.
- 7. Ripon Unified School district has added supplemental materials to help with early phonemic awareness to help support our early readers.
- 8. We are excited to bring back Early Literacy nights for families next year
- 9. 3rd grade will be bringing back cursive this upcoming year
- 10. Next year we will be having many newer 6th, 7th, and 8th grade teachers so we will be providing quite a bit of math professional development again this year to help support those teachers.
- 11. English Learner scores show that we are still needing to support them more intensely and how we plan on that moving forward
 - a. We have increased our number of reclassifications again this year
- 12. This year the highschool fell into ATSI due to their English Learner scores so we are reworking on how to best support those learners

- 3. Dashboard
 - a. This data is used to help us write our LCAP
- 4. Additional LCAP Input
 - a. WE- 8th grade seems to be lacking in study skills (how to study) Is there a way to start this earlier so that they learn how to study before they are too late?
 - i. Everything in provided in powerpoint so information is getting lost
 - ii. PV- a note-taking class would be helpful, there was a study that was recently published to show that people who physically write their notes learn 6x better than those who type.
 - iii. 4th/5th grade would be best for our students

 - i. We will be for sure having 4 TK classes, but we are still trying to figure out if we will need a 5th

- b. Ripona Language Academy (Kindergarten 4th grade)

- d. Art position (Elementary art teacher)
 - i. Our 3rd grade Art teacher will be moved exclusively to the highschool so we have hired an elementary teacher to teach to a few different grade levels
- e. Missoula Children's Theater (Hercules, Pinocchio, and Sleeping Beauty)
- f. Summer School update
 - i. We have a little over 170 students signed up for summer school
 - 1. General summer school was invitation only, based on Benchmark scores
 - ii. School of Rock has about 25 students
 - iii. STEAM have almost 75 students enrolled
 - 1. 3 Weston teachers will be teaming up with the county to teach STEAM lessons
- 6. Round Table
 - a. CO- How much longer will we have Wonders?
 - i. Mrs. Phelps- thought for at least 4 more years, until our next adoption. I do know Heggerty is working on having a full reading program in time for the next adoption.
