The Governing Board of the Tanque Verde Unified School District #13, Pima County, Tucson, Arizona held a Study Session Board meeting on August 27, 2015 in the Board Room, at the Tanque Verde Unified School District Administrative Office, 2300 N. Tanque Verde Loop Rd., Tucson, Arizona 85749. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

2. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

MOTION: Mr. Auslander made a motion to approve the agenda. Mr. Ruiz seconded; the motion carried unanimously.

MOTION: Mr. Neff made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda. Mr. Auslander seconded; the motion carried unanimously.

5. INFORMATION AND DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. TargetEd Demo – Ms. Sherri Rosalik

Ms. Rosalik demonstrated the online TargetEd curriculum product for board members. She provided each board member with instructions on logging into TargetEd. She reminded board members that TargetEd is a K-12 curriculum product – it was purchased for a nominal one time only fee of \$500 per campus. TargetEd is a database of curriculum resources that are fully vetted, standards-based, and include materials from a variety of vendors: PBS; National Archives; Khan Academy; K-12; Engage NY, and more.

Ms. Rosalik logged in and navigated through the TalentEd website, demonstrating for board members how comprehensive, flexible and easy it is to navigate. She said the system allows teachers to share curriculum folders, and access very specific resources. Teachers can access lesson plans, project based units centered on 21st Century skills, video lessons and even game based teaching resources. Teachers can submit their own resources which would be vetted and possibly added. Because the TargetEd curriculum product is web based, it is available for teachers to access at their convenience. Ms. Rosalik has completed teacher training for using this resource on the ACES and EGJH campuses; training is scheduled at TVES and TVHS.

Teachers are just now gaining access to this curriculum TargetEd can measure usage, and teachers will review and determine the value of this product.

Beyond TargetEd asked us to pilot this 'new' program for the 2015-16 SY in return for our active, ongoing feedback. The Beyond TargetEd pilot is a K-8 curriculum from TargetEd that includes curriculum

mapping. It is structured, and provides order and time management with the lesson plans. If after the 'pilot,' we choose to purchase Beyond TargetEd, it will cost approximately \$6.50 per student.

Dr. Livingston presented these exhibits; they are optional exhibits for our consideration. We are in compliance, and therefore he recommends no changes at this time; board members agreed – no additional action required.

Policy Advisory No. 523..... FCB— Retirement of Facilities

Mr. Ruiz presented this policy. Due to recent changes made by the Legislature, Senate Bill 1074 amended A.R.S. 15-189, Charter schools; vacant buildings; list used equipment. School districts are to sell or lease a vacant and unused building or portion of a building to charter schools in the same manner as other potential buyers or lessees while attempting to obtain the highest possible value.

Governing board members discussed the recommended changes; they requested this policy return for a second reading and vote.

Governing board members considered and discussed the recommended changes and concluded, after thoughtful discussion, this policy return for a second reading and vote.

Language to be <u>removed</u> from policy:

The number and type of support staff positions required to implement the District's educational program will be determined annually by the Board after recommendation from the Superintendent.

Governing board members discussed the recommended changes, while they don't anticipate a situation which would necessitate such action, they think it's wise to consider such language should the case ever be necessary. Board members requested this policy return for a second reading and vote.

Policy Advisory No. 526...... IKE-RB — Promotion and Retention of Students

Mr. Ruiz presented this regulation. Senate Bill 1461 adds A.R.S. 15-219 (Dyslexia and reading disability screening, intervention, accommodation and technology) and modifies A.R.S. 15-701 (Common School; promotions; requirements). The applicable language has been inserted into Regulation IKE-RB to provide a student who is in the process of a special education referral or evaluation for placement or a pupil who has been diagnosed as having a significant reading impairment, including dyslexia or another disability as defined in A.R.S. 15-761, with additional mandatory considerations prior to the determination of a promotion/retention decision.

Governing board members discussed the recommended changes. They requested this regulation return for a second reading and vote.

Finally, IKF includes protections for special education students regarding passing scores on the Arizona Instrument to Measure Standards (AIMS) or the test that is identical to the civics portion of the naturalization test under section 15-701.01 with additional considerations as stated in the law and policy language.

Governing board members discussed the recommended changes. They requested this policy return for a second reading and vote.

Policy Advisory No. 528...... JFAB — Tuition/Admission of Nonresident Students

Mr. Auslander presented this policy. House Bill 2479 relating to student tuition added language referencing the eligibility of children who are residents of the United States but non-residents of Arizona for enrollment without payment of tuition if certain conditions are met. These conditions are detailed in the modified Policy JFAB.

Board members discussed the recommended changes. They requested this policy return for a second reading and vote.

Policy Advisory No. 531...... JLF-EB — Reporting Child Abuse/Child Protection

Mr. Auslander presented this exhibit. This language was included in *POLICY SERVICES ADVISORY*, *Volume 26*, *Number 3*, *August 2014*:

Child Protective Services

Child Protective Services (CPS) has changed its name to Department of Child Safety (DCS). The former name occurs throughout the Manual in policies, regulations, and exhibits, including the ones distributed in PA 503 (JLF-EB through JLF-ED), March 2014. The Manual will be altered; however, the forms distributed by the agency and the Department of Child Safety (DCS) website still include the older name. These will be updated as the agency releases new publications. The District may alter the name as it develops or changes policies or other documents or substitute the new name as deemed necessary. Policy Services will not duplicate all pertinent DCS forms as exhibits in the Manual. Nevertheless, the JLF-EB exhibit pertaining to interviews at school has been replicated with new DCS language.

Exhibits JLF-EC and JLF-ED have been removed from the model. As they become available, updated forms related to information/records access, removal, custody and related issues should be available from DCS Representatives as they make local school contacts. The school district attorney should be contacted if legal questions or concerns arise. Various DCS forms may be accessed at the following address: Board members discussed the recommended changes. They requested this exhibit return for a second reading and vote.

Mr. Neff presented this regulation and exhibit. *Regulation JQ-R is updated and incorporates a modification of A.R.S.* 43-1089.01 made by House Bill 2483. The deadline for tax credit donations moves from December 31 to April 15. Any donations made after December 31 and on or before April 15 may be applied to either the current or the preceding taxable year.

In addition a link to the AZDOR document GUIDELINES FOR THE PUBLIC SCHOOL EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITY (ECA) TAX CREDIT is provided at the bottom of the regulation. The document that contains the rubric is added as exhibit JQ-EB. Exhibit JQ-E should now be recoded as JQ-EA.

Mr. Neff presented this regulation and exhibit – a significant change. The tax credit donation deadline is changing from Dec. 31 to April 15. Dr. Livingston asked that the student fees be reviewed thoroughly. All requested this return for a second reading and vote.

Penalties may be attached for non-compliance; however, the Governor's Letter of March 30, 2015, iterates his concerns pertaining to "ambiguities which should be addressed by the Arizona Department of Education – how and to whom the alleged violation would be reported, who investigates, from whom would a final ruling be made, and appeal."

Board members requested this regulation return for a second reading and vote.

Mr. Neff presented this regulation. *Policy Services has received questions pertaining to the cost a district may charge for providing documents related to a request for public records found in Policy KDB and Regulation KDB-R titled Public Right to Know/Freedom of Information.*

Regulation KDB-R provides districts the opportunity to specifically address the cost of materials requested related to board minutes, agendas, financial records, contracts, course of study and statistical summaries. Additionally the regulation provides opportunities to address the cost of other materials that are not referenced. The cost for providing these materials is to be determined by each district.

There was discussion regarding the language in the regulation. Board members asked if we could research what other districts are doing, and if anything, consider using language such as: A fee of up to \$____may be levied on each request to cover the cost of making copies.

All requested this return for a second reading and vote.

C. Policy Alerts - Volume 2015, Number 1 – July 2015 – Board Members

The follow information Alert was received by Arizona School Boards Association: Temporary Moratorium - Standardized Tests for High School Graduation Senate Bill 1191 provides for a temporary moratorium on the requirement of obtaining a passing score on a standardized test in order to graduate from high school. This has been enacted as an emergency measure and is effective for the 2014-2015, 2015-2016, 2016-2017, and 2017-2018 school years. The civics portion of the naturalization test under section 15-701.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, is not included in the moratorium. This has not been codified in Arizona Revised Statutes.

The follow Alert was received by Arizona School Boards Association: Retroactive Effect - Pupil's Score on an Assessment and Letter Grades

Senate Bill 1289 prescribes a transition process to revise the school and school district accountability system. The bill states "Notwithstanding any other law, a pupil's score on an assessment selected pursuant to section 15-741, Arizona Revised Statutes, may not be used as a factor in determining a pupil's letter grade in any particular course in school years 2014-2015 and 2015-2016" and "is effective retroactively to from and after June 30, 2014." This has not been codified in Arizona Revised Statutes. The Governor's Letter of March 27, 2015, expresses among other concerns that "the Arizona Board of Education should look to best practices in other states . . . and replicate what works in these states." Further, the State Board of Education and Arizona Department of Education should encourage public engagement and input.

Policies BDB, Meeting Procedures/Bylaws and BEDBA, Agenda Preparation and Dissemination Our policy language is in compliance.

Policy GCO, Evaluation of Professional Staff Members Our policy language is in compliance.

Ms. Sharp advised board members this policy and regulation is currently under review. This will be up for board consideration once the review is complete.

Community and student feedback has all been positive.

Ms. Sharp announced the After School Program transportation issue from ACES to TVES has been resolved; Ms. Lindflott now has a direct route from ACES to TVES.

A tutoring program partnership between Amity and the school district is being relocated from TVES to a Church in the area pending a successful transportation of students plan. Teachers from TVES and volunteers from the Church will be working together to help students with achievement.

Ms. Sharp announced there is a fundraiser at ACES and TVES: The Chalk Art Marathon on Sept. 9 From 12:30 to 5:30 – all students Kindergarten through 8th grade are invited to participate by creating their best chalk drawing of the *Art of Science* or the *Science of Art* – there is a \$5. entry free. The top 6 drawings from each campus will win prizes and be printed in a collaborative calendar celebrating Science and Art. The calendar will be sold to raise money for the Art program.

The monthly Produce on Wheels – With Out Waste (POW WOW) was cancelled last weekend due to lack of vegetables.

Ms. Place added that ACES Nurse DeRose distributes vegetables to all the campuses after this monthly event.
