## PE ELL FACILITIES UPDATE

## Modernization Plans

Pe Ell School is planning to utilize multiple funding sources to achieve a comprehensive major modernization of the school facilities. Anticipated scope is to include, but not be limited to, upgrades to classroom learning environments and technology, safety and security, building envelope, building infrastructure, heating and cooling, lighting, interior finishes, restrooms, kitchen, fixtures, and equipment. Site upgrades outside of the buildings are also being considered.

## Small District Schools Modernization Grants

The school district has been awarded a Rural Modernization Grant I - Funded through construction as well as a second Rural Modernization Grant, currently funded through planning, with construction funding anticipated by July 2025. Both Grants have been awarded by OSPI.

## School Construction Assistance Program (SCAP) funds

The school district is also now eligible to receive School Construction Assistance Program (SCAP) funds that are accessible via use of the Rural Modernization Grant funds as the required local share.

## \$1.9M Bond Measure

The Pe Ell School Board of Directors set aside time in their August, September, October, and November regular meetings for discussion and public input about running a bond measure that will become active when the current bond expires. The District School Board approved a ballot measure on November 30 for a $\$ 1.9 \mathrm{M}$ bond measure in support of the modernization for items not covered by either the Rural Modernization Grants or SCAP funds. The bond will also allow timber dollars to continue flow into debt service for future facility improvements and to lower taxes.

Bond items include:

- Track replacement and football field improvements and irrigation.
- Temporary classrooms for displaced classes during construction activities (portables).
- Other site upgrades including school and youth ball fields.
- Overall project planning and unforeseen building costs.


## Timelines

The Bond is planned to run on the February 2024 Ballot.
Design for the major modernization is planned to begin the Winter of 2024, with Bid and Construction anticipated to begin in Summer 2025.
