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## **Special Education-Title1/LAP Social Emotional Learning (SEL): Mrs. Duren**

During the month of December, in SEL class, we focus our efforts on the character trait of creativity. The Merriam-Webster Dictionary defines creativity as "The ability to make new things or think of new ideas." Our SEL curriculum further defines creativity as "Using your imagination to create something new or to solve a problem."



There are two aspects of creativity that we put special emphasis on in SEL class which are: the use of creativity to help demonstrate the use of other character traits, and the varied ways creativity can be applied to the everyday life of each person and community. We have taken the opportunity to combine our creativity with gratitude and responsibility when our students decorated our food collection and distribution boxes with positive messages and holiday art for our annual food drive. We demonstrated our creativity in decorating our school tree with homemade decorations, our hallways and windows with lovely art projects, and providing specifically created holiday themed art for display in our district conference room. Our students shared their creativity to others by going out into the community to sing carols at the local senior center and at Cardinal Glass. Our students and staff have also been working hard at preparing for our winter holiday program where they are demonstrating creativity in the forms of acting, singing, dancing, entertaining, story telling, and playing musical instruments. We have further discussed the different ways creativity can be applied to forms of communication, and writing. We have been able to use our read aloud time as well as our activity time to appreciate these forms of creativity as well.

We can see it in a painting as well as in a delicious sandwich or the way we solve a math problem.
