This Sports Physical meets IHSA eligibility requirements for all sports. This physical does NOT meet the requirement for K, 6th, 9th grade school physical, or for new students from out-of state.

Forms will be available in our school offices, on our district website, and at your local FHN healthcare center. A portion of the Sports Physical Form must be completed and signed by a parent BEFORE the exam. The consent for Medical Care Form must be signed and brought with the student.

Sports Physical Cost: \$25. Please make checks payable to FHN

Appointments recommended. Walk-ins are welcome. If you have any questions, please call the District Office at #815-225-5839.

FHN donates the proceeds from the Sports Physicals to the school.

## Nurses Notes:

With the end of the school year fast approaching, it is time to think about physicals for the next school year. Illinois Law states that all children entering pre-school, kindergarten, sixth grade, and ninth grade, as well as new students from out of state, must have a current physical exam, dated no less than one year from the start of the new school year. Immunizations need to be updated at that time also.

For any ongoing health problems (allergies, Asthma, Diabetes, A.D.D., A.D.H.D., Migraines, seizures, intestinal disturbances, and so on) please remember if your child takes medication during the school day, the medication forms need to be filled out by your child's doctor and yourself on a yearly basis. The medication, whether prescription or non-prescription, must be brought to the school in the original package. Medication must be left in the school office. No medication is to be kept in students' possession or lockers.

Dental examinations are required by law for grades kindergarten, second, sixth, and ninth. Vision examinations are required by law for kindergarten and all new students from out of state.

Sport physicals need to be filled out on an "IHSA" form. You may pick these up in the school offices. School physicals can be used for sports; however, sports physicals cannot be used for school.
