SCHOOLOGY (S

Our virtual format is called Schoology. The program is utilized in an environment for K-12 schools and higher education institutions. Schoology allows users to create, manage, and share academic content. Schoology capabilities include attendance records, online gradebook, tests, quizzes, and other class information.

GRADES & HOMEWORK

• Each subject has weighted categories that factor into the final grades.

 Homework is given to practice or review skills. The extra practice is needed to help ensure that students are successful in understanding and retaining skills.

 Work study and conduct are graded. These grades are a part of the qualifications for honor roll, National Honor Society, and clubs.

RETEACHING & RETESTING

Reteaching is essential to our instructional process whenever it is necessary. Students are able to be retested on <u>one</u> failing <u>major</u> assessment per subject each quarter. The goal is to promote student learning and engagement. Failing scores are grades below 60%. Retests will occur within a reasonable timeframe, and the higher of the two grades will be recorded in the gradebook. Student accountability is an important component of reteaching and retesting procedures.

STUDY SKILLS AND HABITS

We understand that students may have earned high scores in the past. However, this grade level is more challenging and rigorous. Study skills are essential at this grade level. Students must learn how to be note-takers. Students must have quiet-time at home in order to focus on the material. A study buddy may be necessary for test preparation. Although instruction is occurring in the classroom, all students will need additional practice at home to be successful.

4TH GRADE CARP

Parent monitoring is necessary and required to help students reach their reading goal each quarter. Students are encouraged to make reading a huge part of their daily routine in addition to their academic learning. Students must have met CARP requirements as a qualification for the National Elementary Honor Society. Please understand as this eliminates students regardless of grades.

For 2nd, 3rd, and 4th quarters we will have a novel that we read as a class with some at home reading. This allows students to develop their reading comprehension and thinking skills. Please purchase the following books before the start of each quarter.

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

- A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.50 is required.
 Average the student's grades for all subjects: A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1
 Includes grades for: Language Arts, Reading, Math, Science, and
 Social Studies
 - Example: $A/4 + A/4 + A/4 + B/3 + A/4 = 19 \div 5 = 3.8$ GPA
- Consistently met CARP goal EVERY quarter (points & percentage)
 Conduct/Work Study/Homework/Enrichment Classes
 Students must have earned: 3.5 average in conduct, S in Work Study
 Skills, S in Homework, and S in Enrichment classes.
- Students must be in good standing regarding behavior.

CONDUCT & WORK STUDY

Students are expected to be respectful, attentive, and productive throughout the school day. They are graded for conduct and work study.
