School Counseling Update: February - March 2023

1ST SEMESTER REPORT CARDS

Report cards have been disbursed to students in class for them to take home. Final grades can also be viewed in ParentVUE under Semester 1 in the Grade Book tab. If fees are still pending for 1st semester, your child will be issued a fee notice instead of a report card. Fees can be paid at the Bookstore or online. Once fees are paid, a report card can be collected from the Counseling Office.

\$MONEY\$ FOR POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION

Seniors and Parents: If you have not already completed the application for FAFSA, please do this ASAP! The distribution of money is on a first come/first serve basis; thus, it is quite important to complete (even if your senior is still unsure if attending a postsecondary institute). Please go to https://fafsa.gov/ and click on "Start a New FAFSA." Make sure that you select the 2023-24 year. If you need assistance, our Career Center Counselor, Kaymee Kelly (KKelly@lhusd.org), can assist along with your student's alpha assigned counselor.

COURSE PRE-REGISTRATION 2022-2023

In February and March, students will meet with their counselors to select classes for the 2023-2024 school year. The updated Course Description Guide (CDG) will be available online and in hard copy by mid February. Students may review hard copies of the CDG in the Counseling Office, Career Center, or Library. It is important that students review course descriptions, pre-requisite information, and make careful decisions about their classes. During pre-registration, students will be given copies of their transcripts and graduation status reports. Please ask your student about this important information regarding their credits and course selections based on their four-year plan.

Also, review the courses your student has chosen and discuss if the courses are a best fit choice. Please discuss any concerns about classes with your student's counselor. DUAL ENROLLMENT (DE) CLASSES FOR JUNIORS AND SENIORS, 2023-2024

For non-Math DE classes (History, English, Health, Business, Art):

Second semester of Sophomore English (English 4) grade must be B or higher (last semester grade-must be at least sophomore level) **OR**

ACT Score (Reading \ge 21; Writing \ge 21)

For Math DE classes: [MAT 142 (College Math) or MAT 151 (College Algebra)]

All high school Math classes GPA: 3.0 **AND** also completed ALG 3-4 with an average of B or better **OR** ACT Score (Math ≥22) **OR** SAT Score (Math ≥530)= MAT 142; SAT Score (Math ≥550)= MAT 151

ECAP LESSONS FOR 9TH GRADERS

At the end of January, counselors will meet with all 9th graders to review their ECAP (Education Career Action Plan). Students may access their ECAP portfolio and activities through the web-based Major Clarity website. The website (https://majorclarity.com/) is available for all students and will continue to be used throughout their high school career. All students are encouraged to review and use the tools available to them on a regular basis. Below is a brief overview of what the 9th graders will complete in their ECAP with counselor assistance. We encourage students to use their account regularly so that they can enhance their high school college and career readiness, as we are not able to cover every activity (in Major Clarity) throughout the four years of high school.

Grade	Activity
9th	 * Start a 4-year course planner (ALL courses from 2022-23 and then a minimum of 5 classes for sophomore year) * Choose an academic/career pathway of interest * Review LHHS graduation requirements and individual transcripts * Review current GPA and calculate college readiness GPA

On the ADE website you can download the "ECAP at a Glance" in <u>English</u> or <u>Spanish</u>. Copies of this handout will be available on our website as well as for pickup in the Counseling Office.

Parents: We encourage you to have a conversation with your student about ECAP and Major Clarity. Future planning is critical to ensure that students meet graduation requirements, have knowledge about programs of study and are able to pursue their post-secondary goals. Your involvement is extremely important!
