Remember to take good care of yourself  
This week has been emotionally difficult for people in Oregon and all over the country. Not only do we have COVID-19 exhaustion, but we are facing difficulties together as a collective. ## ATTENDANCE

Reminder that students that have selected Hybrid for Term 3 are expected to **attend ALL virtual classes on the days that they are onsite**.
